## **Nationwide Crime Analysis 2020 vs 2019**

Preliminary figures for 2020 indicate that major crimes decreased by 16% with 4,243 cases, compared to 5,042 in 2019. Crimes against the person decreased by 12% with 724 incidents, compared to 914 in 2019. Property crimes decreased by 15% with 3,519 incidents, compared to 4,128 in 2019. There were regional decreases in New Providence and the Family Islands District at rates of 17% and 21% respectively when compared to 2019.

**Homicides** decreased by 23% with 73 incidents, compared to 95 in 2019. There were 59 murders in New Providence, 9 in Grand Bahama, and 5 in the Family Islands District with an overall solvency rate of 75%. Victims between the ages of 18 and 35 represented 62% of all homicides. Retaliation and conflict were the most common motives for murder representing 54% collectively. Based on preliminary figures, homicides were more likely to occur on a Tuesday than any other day of the week. Homicides were more prevalent in the **Southern Division** which accounted for 16% of the overall total. Fatal gunshot wound was the leading cause of death for homicides accounting for 57 incidents.

Armed robberies decreased by 41% with 313 incidents, compared to 531 in 2019. **Armed robberies** occurred mostly between the hours of 4pm and 12am. Based on preliminary figures, armed robberies were more likely to occur on a Thursday than any other day of the week. Armed robberies were more prevalent in the **Southeastern Division** which accounted for 18% of the overall total. Most armed robberies occurred on the streets with business establishments and residences close behind. Based on preliminary figures, armed robberies were more likely to occur on a Thursday than any other day of the week. Firearms continue to be the weapon of choice for the commission of armed robberies. Males represented the highest percentage of victims at 65%, compared to female victims at 35%.

**Robberies** decreased by 4% with 91 incidents, compared to 95 in 2019. Robberies occurred mostly between the hours of 6pm and 8pm. Based on preliminary figures, robberies were more likely to occur on a Tuesday than any other day of the week. Males represented the highest percentage of victims at 62%, compared to female victims at 38%.

**Stolen vehicles** decreased by 19% with 229 incidents, compared to 283 in 2019. **Hondas** were the most targeted vehicles of choice representing 34% of all vehicles stolen. Accords and Fits were the predominant models stolen while residences were the most targeted locations. Stolen vehicle cases were more prevalent in the **Southwestern Division** which accounted for 21% of the overall total. Thirty-eight percent of stolen vehicles for 2020 were recovered.

**Stealing from vehicles** decreased by 32% with 1,099 incidents, compared to 1,620 in 2019. The most frequent items stolen included front bumpers, car batteries and cellular phones. Nissans Notes were mostly targeted with Honda Accords trending close behind. Based on preliminary figures, stealing from vehicles were more likely to occur on a Thursday than any other day of the week.

**Housebreakings** decreased by 13% with 598 incidents, compared to 684 in 2019. **New Providence District** accounted for 379 or 63% of all housebreakings, most of which occurred in the **Eastern Division**. **Grand Bahama including Abaco and Bimini** accounted for 126 or 21% of housebreakings. The **Family Islands District** accounted for the remaining 16%, most of which occurred in Eluethera with 40 incidents.

For the period in review, a total of 279 **firearms** and 4,044 rounds of ammunition were discovered and/or seized throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. As a result, 178 persons were charged with possession of illegal firearms. Additionally, **ShotSpotter** detected a total of 467 gunshot incidents, consisting of 317 multiple shots and 150 single shot incidents, totaling 1,784 rounds discharged.

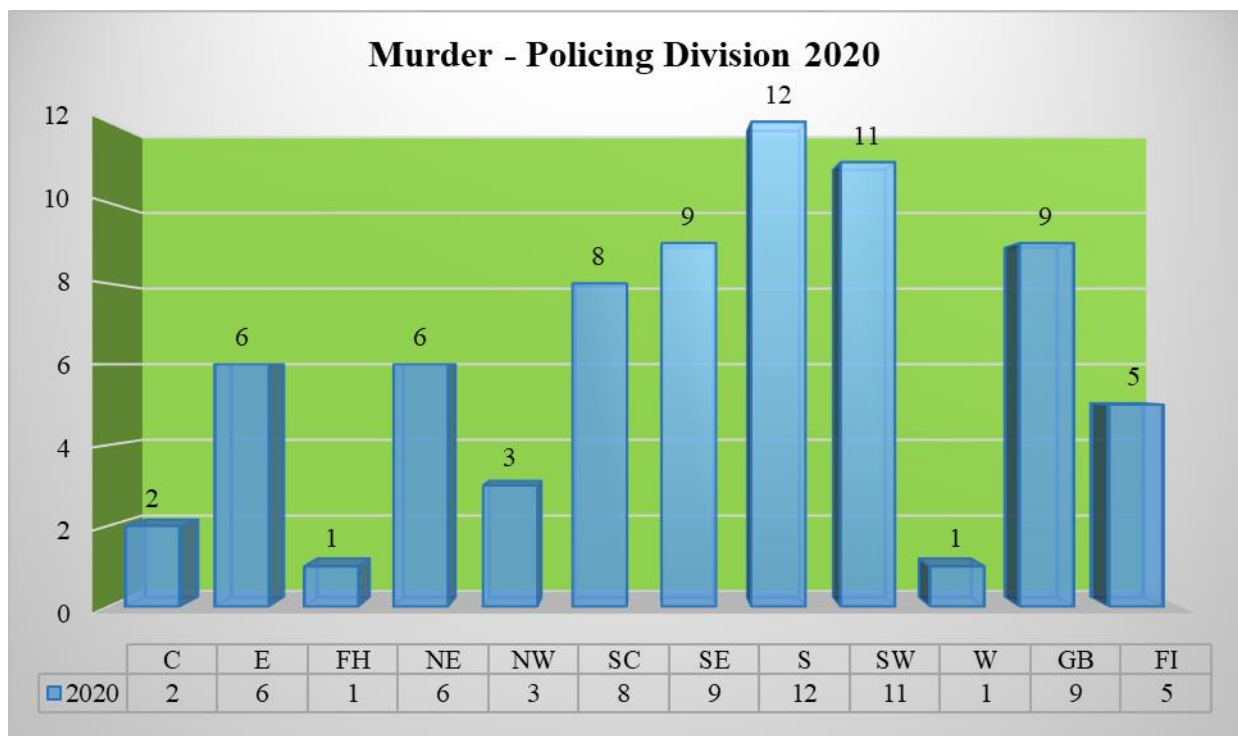
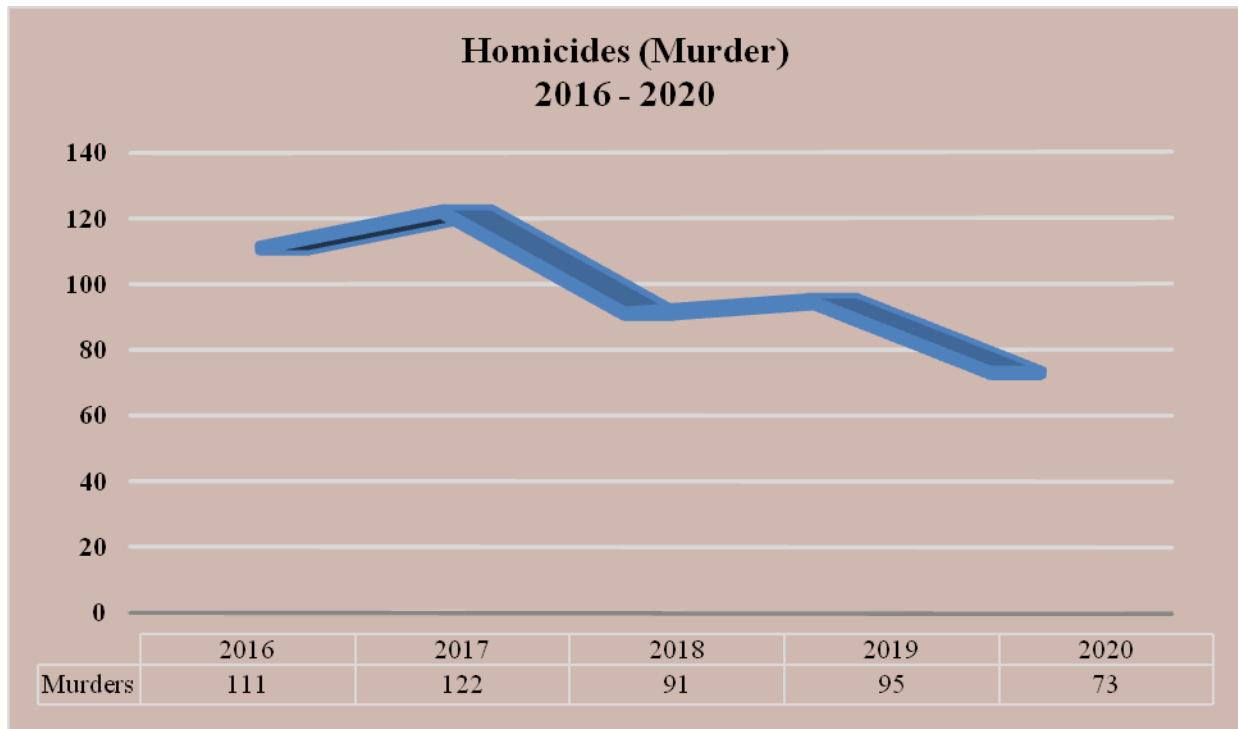
There were 2,370 curfew breaches and an additional 1,905 breaches to the Emergency Powers Order. Furthermore, officers of the Royal Bahamas Police Force conducted 9,229 field check patrols, 1,059 road checks and executed 1,556 warrants of arrest throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. As a result of these efforts, 1,383 persons were arrested and 1,120 suspects were charged for possession of dangerous drugs.

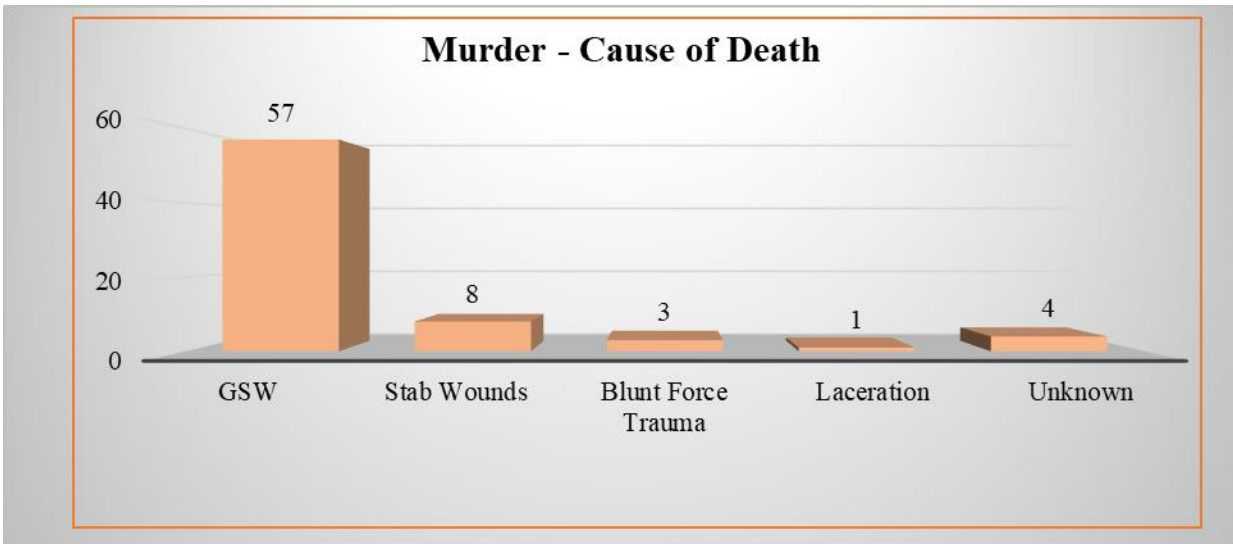

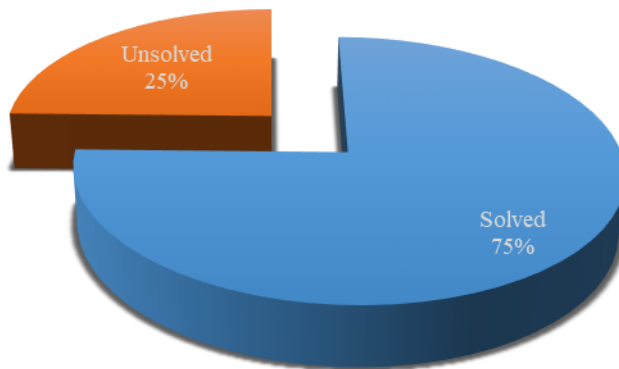
In 2020, murders decreased by 23% with 73 cases compared, to 95 in 2019.

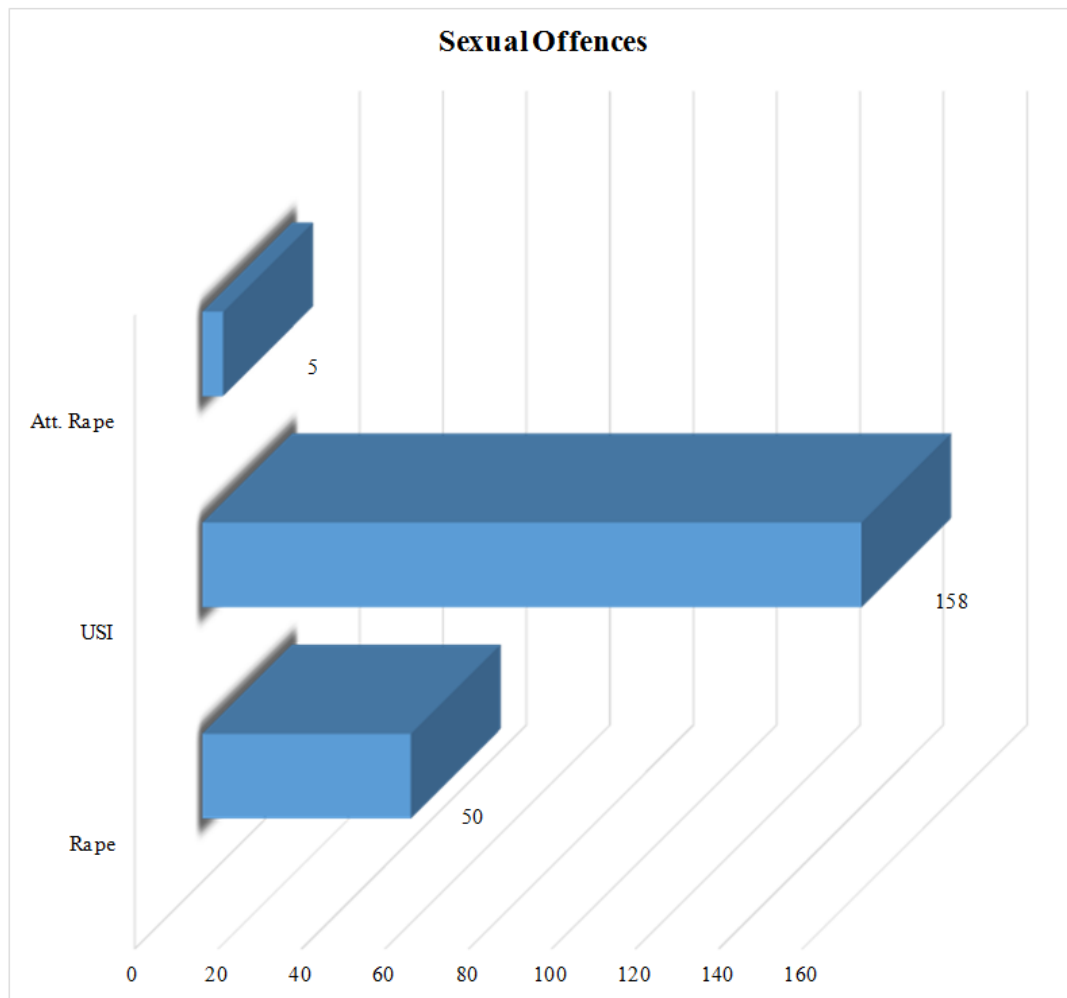
### Murder Solvency Rate

## Sexual Offences

In 2020, reports of sexual offences increased by 34% with 213 cases, compared to 159 in 2019. These offences include rape, unlawful sexual intercourse and attempted rape. Investigators have noted a recent trend in sexual offence cases occurring at Air BNB Rentals where parties were being hosted. (N.B. Unlawful sexual intercourse includes incest).

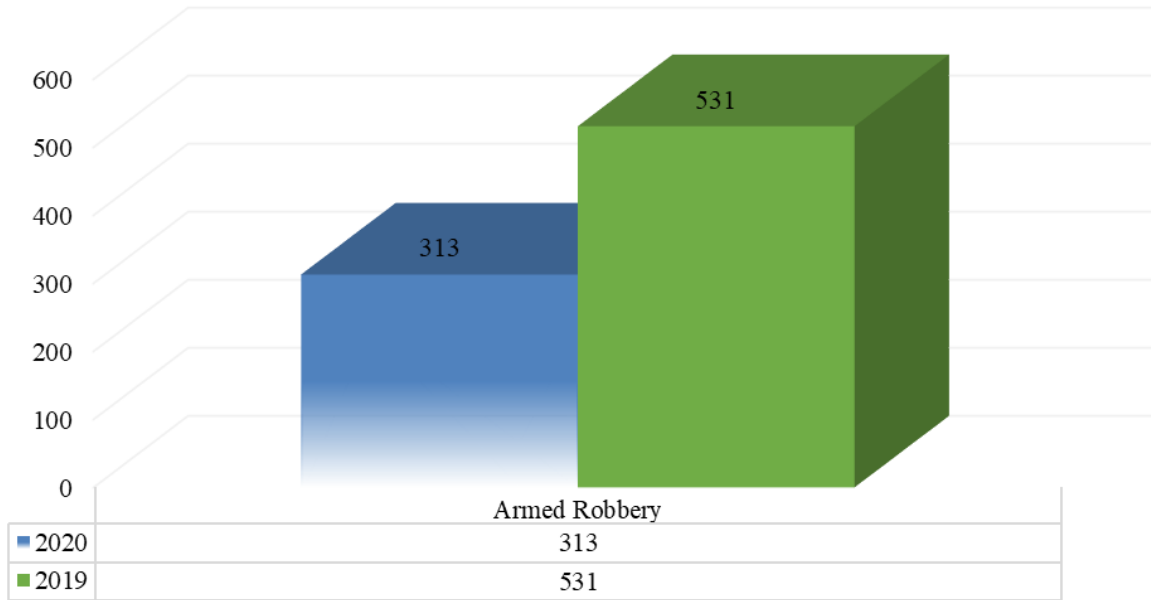




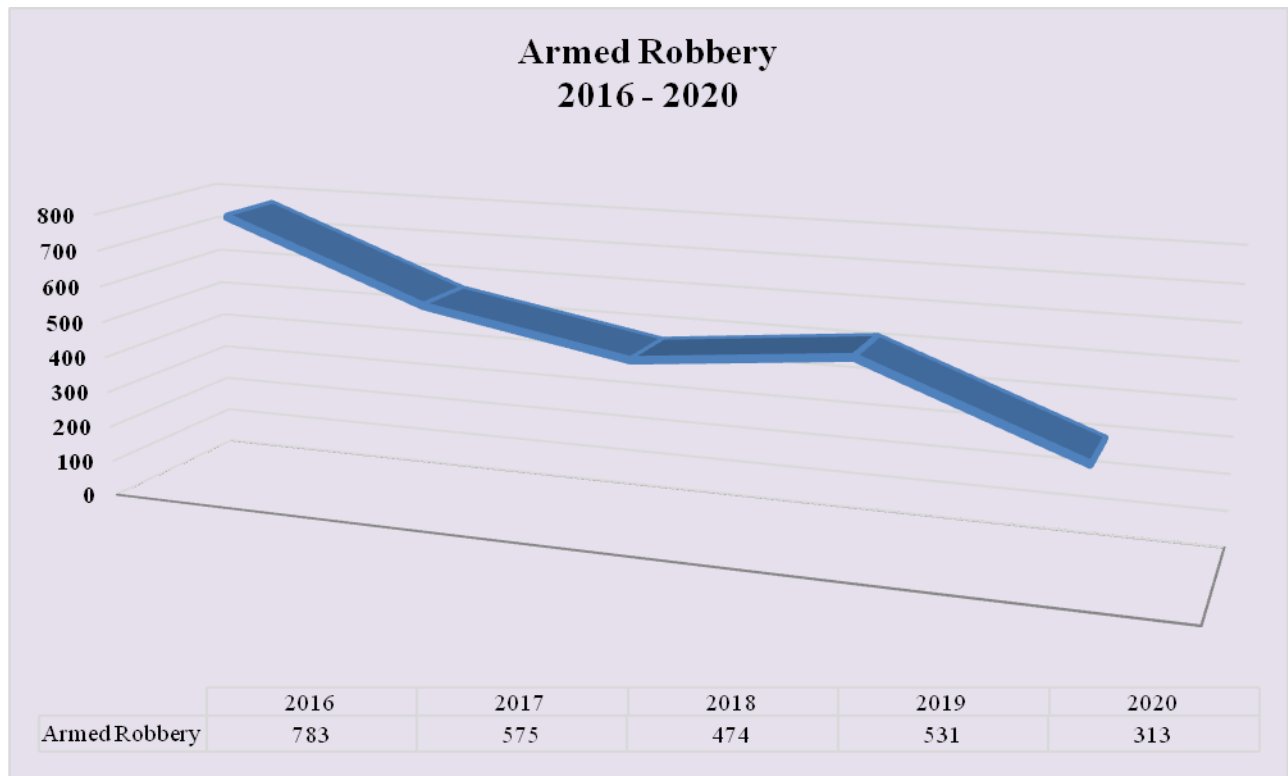
## Armed Robbery

For the period in review, armed robberies decreased by 41% with 313 incidents, compared to 531 in 2019.

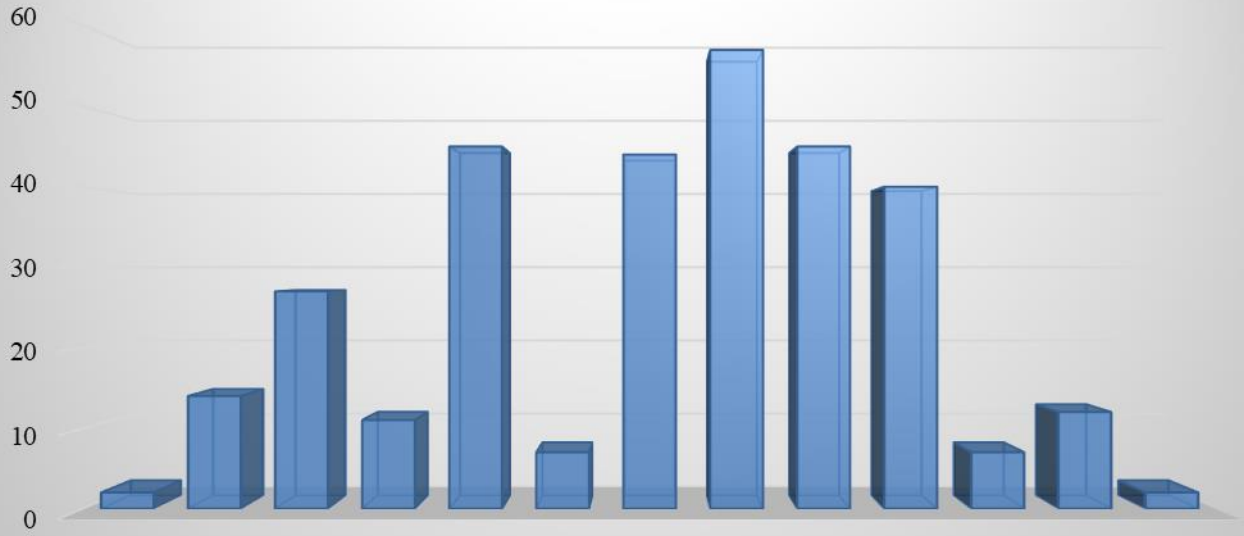
### Armed Robbery 2020 vs 2019



### Armed Robbery 2016 - 2020

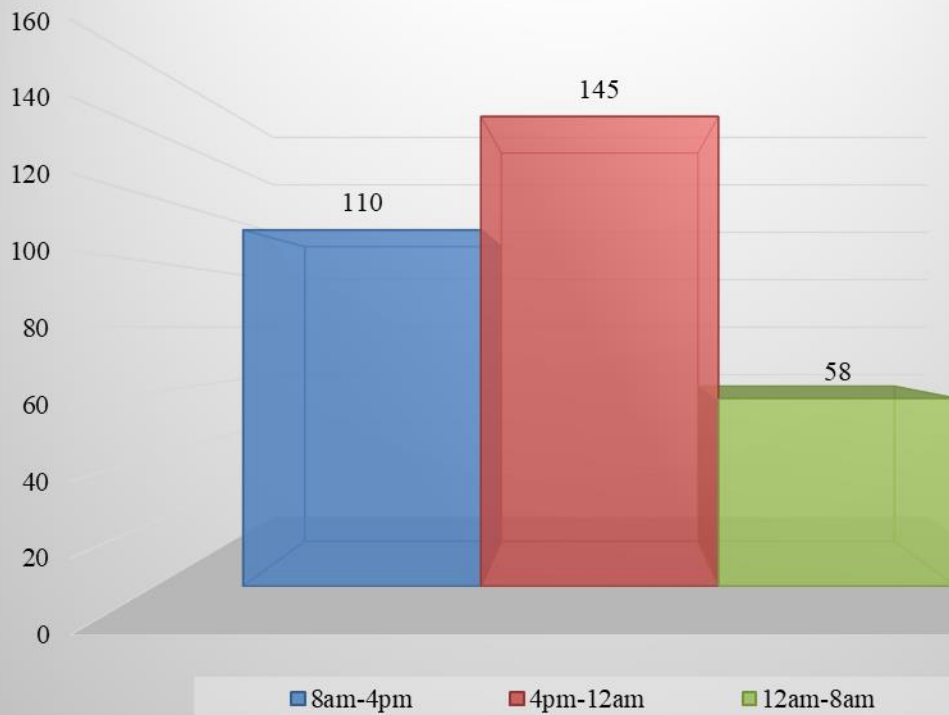

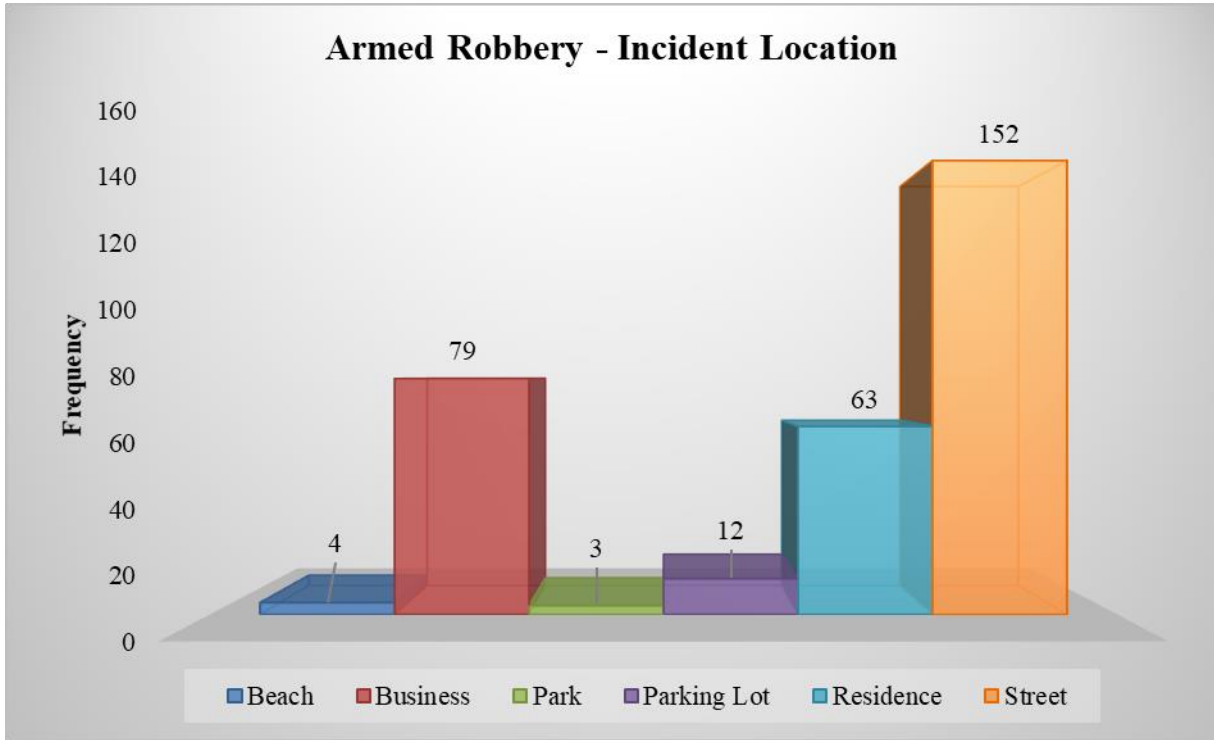

### Armed Robbery - Time of Day

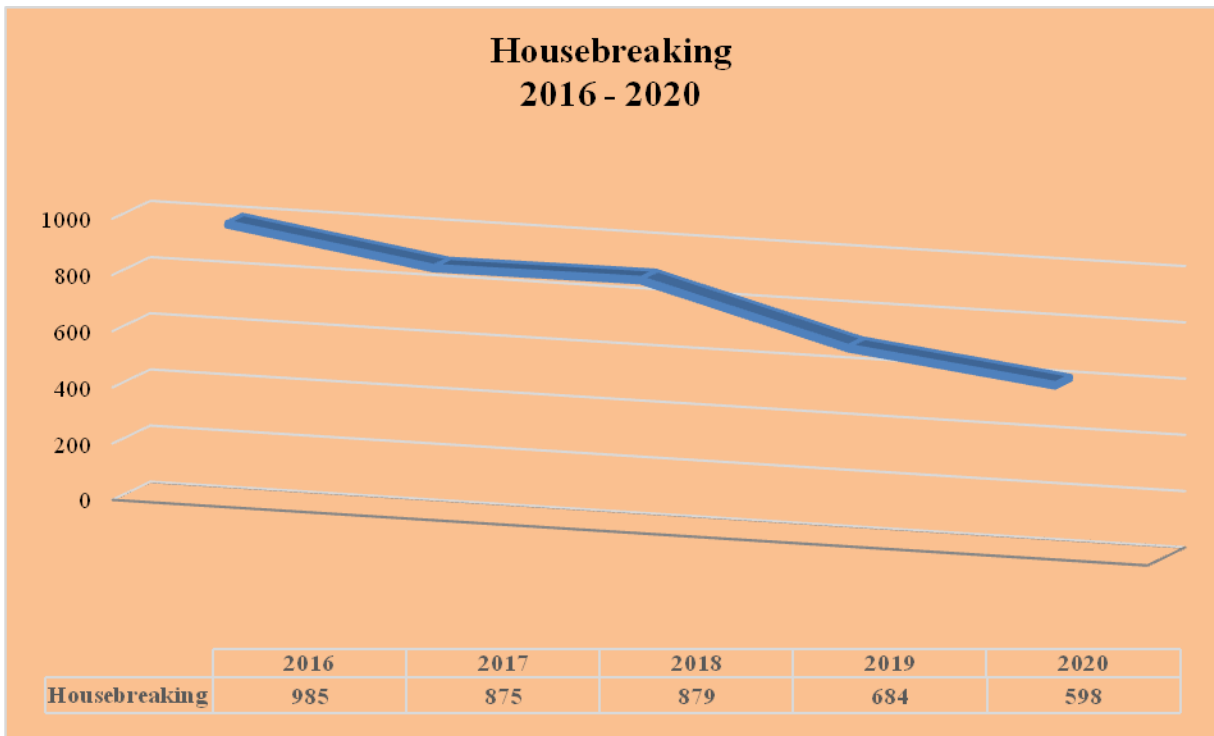

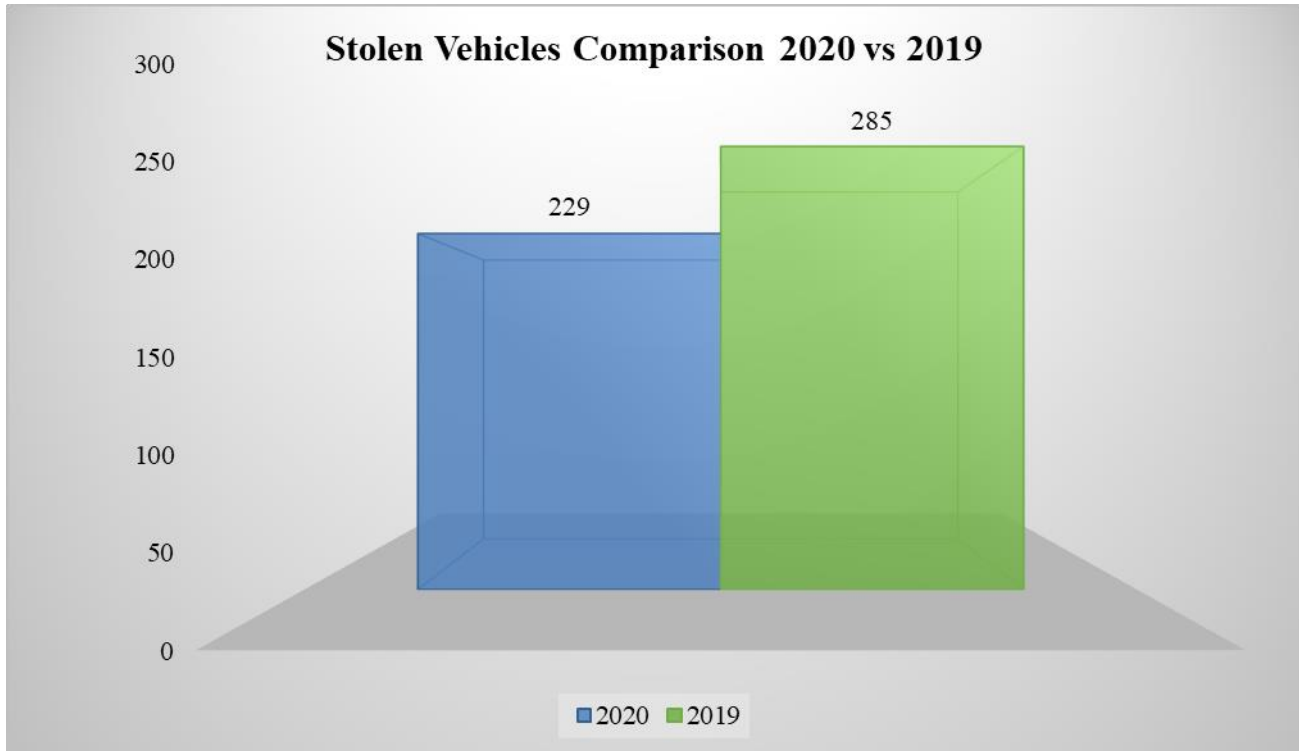
In 2020, housebreaking decreased by 13% with 598 incidents, compared to 684 in 2019.



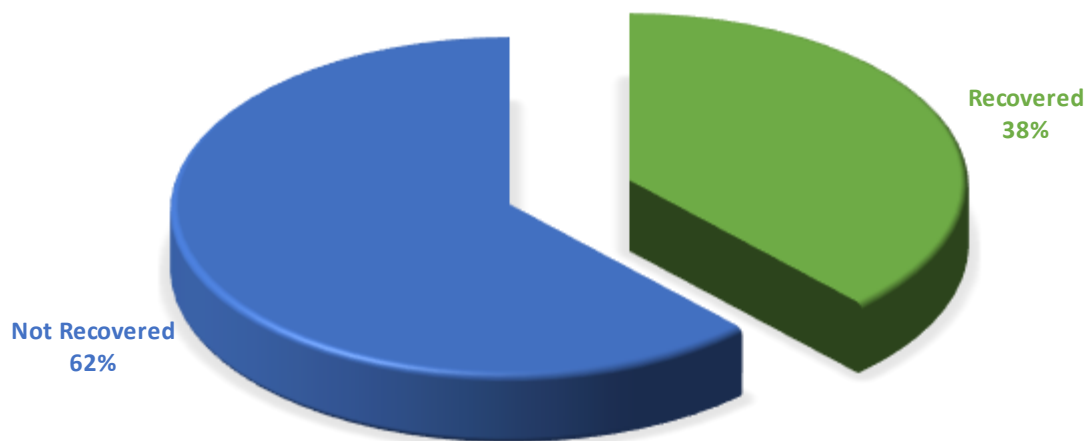

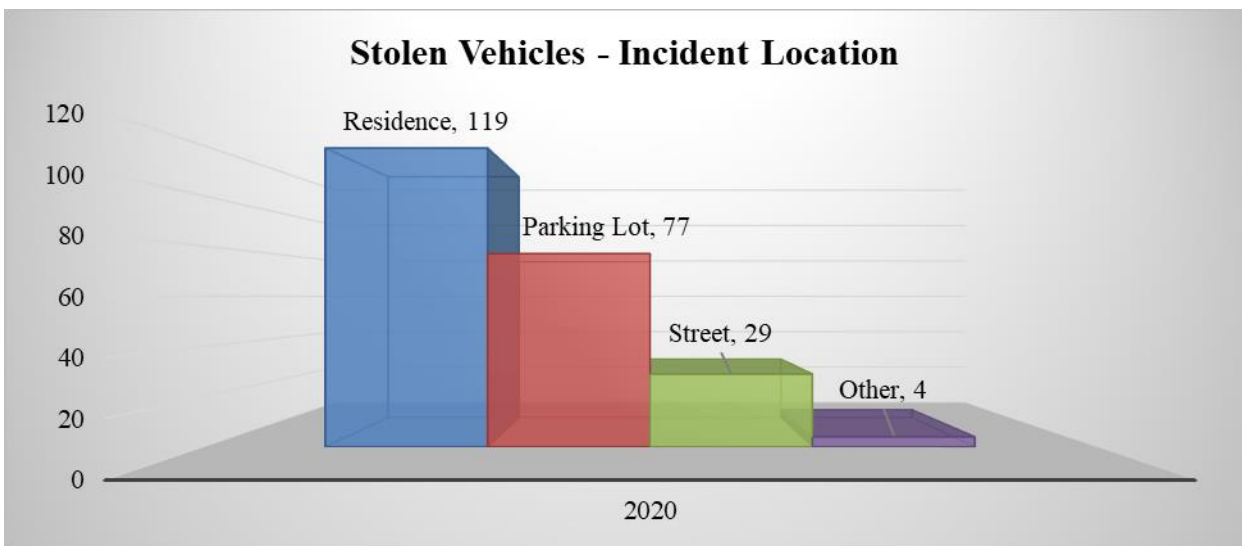
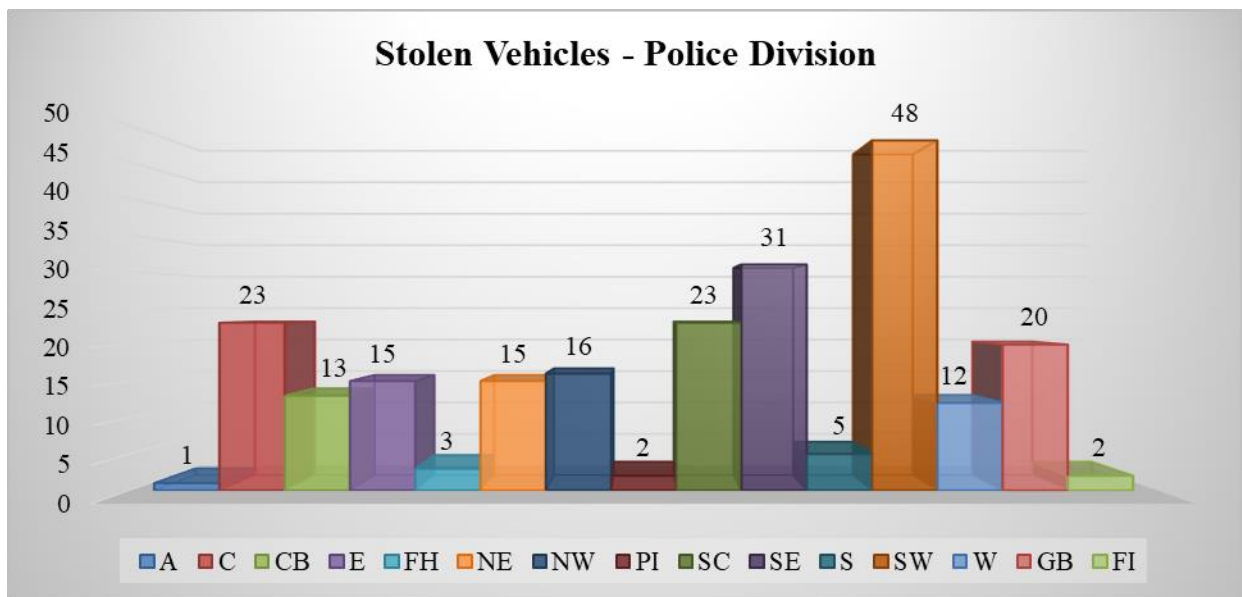
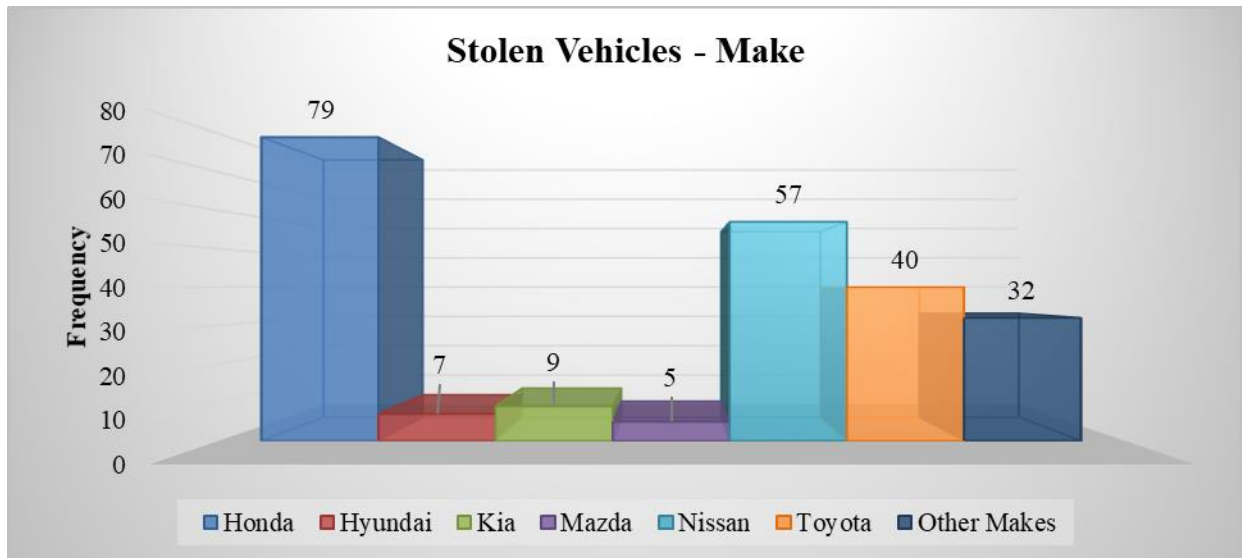
## Stolen Vehicles

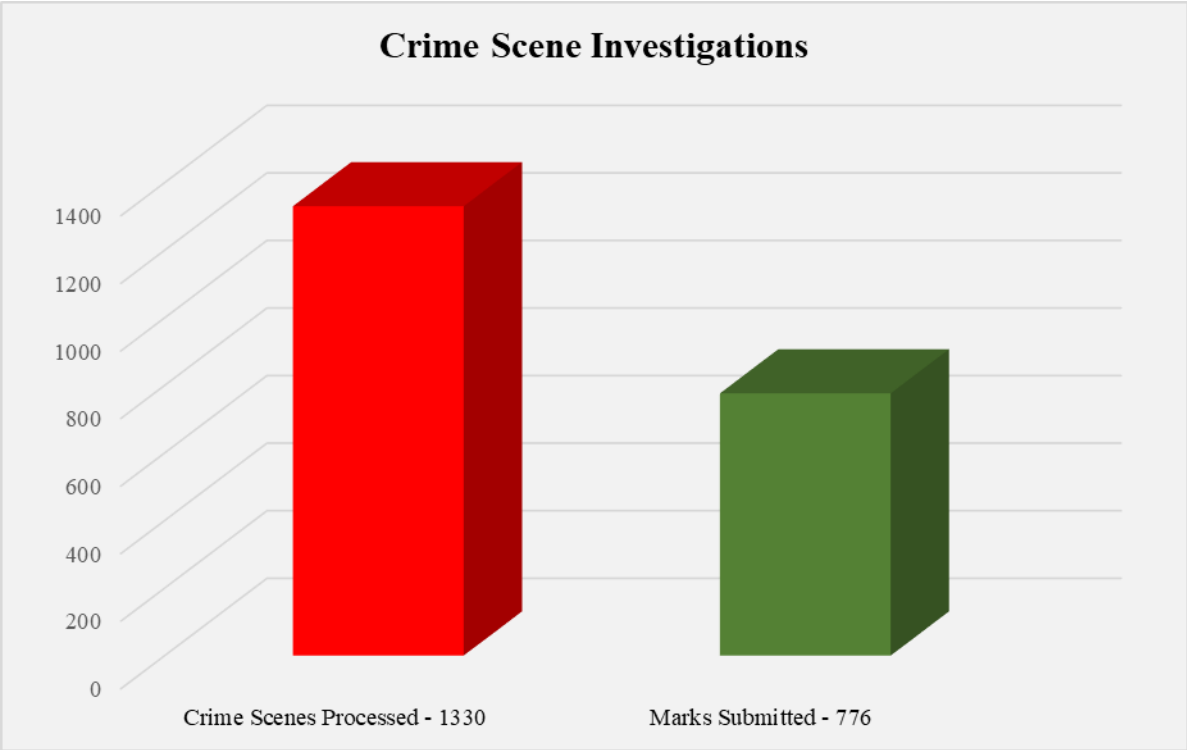
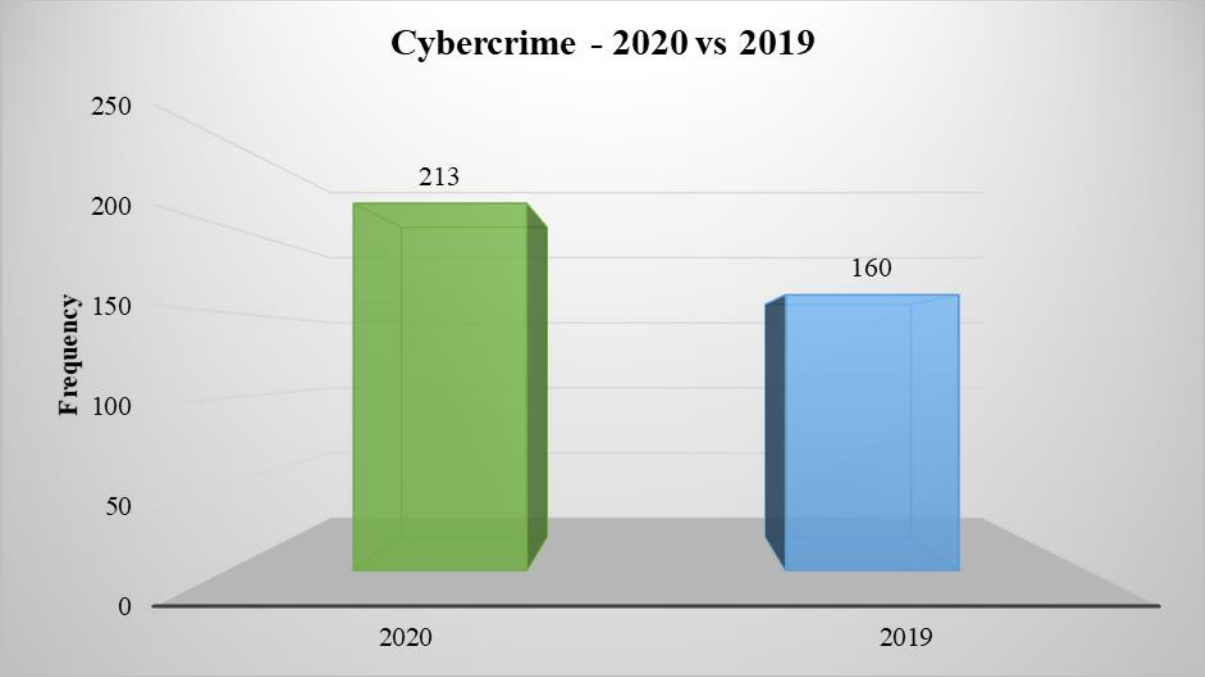

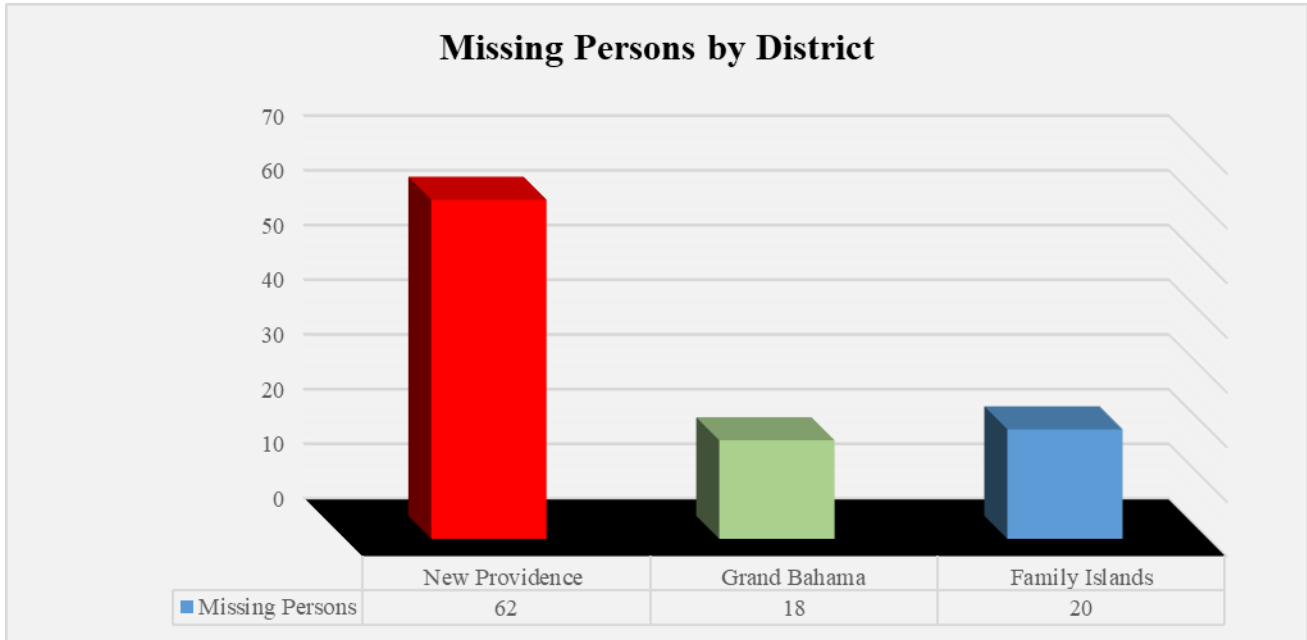
