Nationwide Crime Analysis March 2021 vs 2020

Preliminary figures for March 2021 indicate that major crimes increased by 8% with 299 cases, compared to 278 in 2020. Crimes against the person increased by 60% with 83 incidents, compared to 52 in 2020. Property crimes decreased by 4% with 216 incidents, compared to 226 in 2020. There were regional increases in New Providence and the Grand Bahama District at rates of 10% and 19% respectively when compared to 2020.

Homicides increased by 50% with 9 incidents, compared to 6 over the same period in 2020. There were 9 murders in New Providence and 1 in the Abaco Division. The murder solvency rate for the period stands at 56%. Victims between the ages of 18 and 35 represented 56% of all homicides. Based on preliminary figures, homicides were more likely to occur on a Thursday than any other day of the week. Homicides were more prevalent in the **Fox Hill** and **Northeastern Division** which accounted for 44% of the overall total. Fatal gunshot wound was the cause of death for all homicides for the period in review.

Armed robberies increased by 52% with 38 incidents, compared to 25 over the same period in 2020. **Armed robberies** occurred mostly between the hours of 12pm and 4pm. Based on preliminary figures, armed robberies were more likely to occur on a Friday or Tuesday than any other day of the week. Armed robberies were more prevalent in the **Northeastern Division** which accounted for 26% of the overall total. Most armed robberies occurred at business establishments with streets close behind. Firearms continue to be the weapon of choice for the commission of armed robberies. Males represented the highest percentage of victims at 69%, compared to female victims at 31%.

Robberies increased by 50% with 9 incidents, compared to 6 over the same period in 2020. Robberies occurred mostly between the hours of 6pm and 10pm. Based on preliminary figures, robberies were more likely to occur on a Thursday than any other day of the week. Males represented the highest percentage of victims at 60%, compared to female victims at 40%.

Stolen vehicles increased by 19% with 19 incidents, compared to 16 over the same period in 2020. **Toyotas** and **Nissans** were the most targeted vehicles of choice representing 32% and 37% respectively. Toyota Passo was the predominant vehicle model representing 32% of total vehicles stolen. Residences were the most targeted locations and the **Eastern Division** accounted for the majority of stolen vehicles at 26%. Sixteen percent of stolen vehicles in March 2021 were recovered.

Stealing from vehicles increased by 50% with 48 incidents, compared to 32 over the same period in 2020. The most frequent items stolen included of cash, electronics, tools, and auto parts. Nissan Cubes and Notes were the most targeted vehicles for this crime. Based on preliminary figures, stealing from vehicles were more likely to occur on a Monday than any other day of the week. Stealing from vehicle cases were more prevalent in the **Southwestern Division** which accounted for 33% of the overall total for the month.

New Providence District accounted for 29 or 69% of all housebreakings, most of which occurred in the **Southwestern** Division. **Grand Bahama including Abaco and Bimini** accounted for 6 or 14% of housebreakings. The **Family Islands District** accounted for the remaining 17% with 7 incidents including 2 in Cat Island, 2 in Eleuthera, 2 in Exuma and 1 in Andros.

For the period in review, a total of 21 **firearms** and 226 rounds of ammunition were discovered and/or seized throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. As a result, 16 persons were charged with possession of illegal firearms. Additionally, **ShotSpotter** detected a total of 99 gunshot incidents, consisting of 81 multiple shots and 18 single shot incidents, totaling 385 rounds discharged.

There were 246 breaches to the Emergency Powers Order including 89 curfew violations and 157 other breaches. The Force also responded to 4 Covid 19 calls for assistance. Furthermore, officers of the Royal Bahamas Police Force conducted 1,035 field check patrols, 52 road checks and executed 65 warrants of arrest throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. As a result of these efforts, 147 persons were arrested and 128 suspects were charged for possession of dangerous drugs.






Murder

In 2021, murders for March increased by 80% with 9 cases compared to 5 over the same period in 2020.












Sexual Offences







Armed Robbery


For the period in review, armed robberies increased by 52% with 38 incidents, compared to 25 in 2020.


Armed Robbery March 2021 vs 2020


















Housebreakings

For the period March 2021, housebreaking decreased by 16% with 42 incidents, compared to 50 over the same period in 2020. Based on preliminary figures, housebreakings were more likely to occur on a Tuesday than any other day of the week.











Stealing from Vehicle

For the period March 2021, stealing from a vehicle increased by 50% with 48 incidents, compared to 32 over the same period in 2020. Items of choice stolen from vehicles mostly consisted of cash, electronics, tools, and auto parts. Other items consisted of personal documents, jewelry and audio speakers. Residences were the most targeted areas for this crime representing 52% of total incidents. Other locations include beaches, parks and open yards. Stealing from vehicles mostly occurred within the Southwestern division.






Stealing from Vehicle - Location Type March 2021




Stolen Vehicle

In March 2021, stolen vehicles increased by 19% with 19 incidents, compared to 16 over the same period in 2020. Three or 16% of vehicles stolen for the month were recovered.




Cybercrime
