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## **Nationwide Crime Analysis Mid-Year 2026 vs 2025**

Preliminary figures for the mid-year 2026 indicate that major crimes decreased by 6% with 1,153 cases, compared to 1,223 over the same period in 2025. There were regional decreases across the board in New Providence, Grand Bahama and the Northern Bahamas, and the Family Islands District at rates of 3%, 10% and 23% respectively.

Crimes against the property decreased by 9%, with 874 incidents, compared to 961 over the same period in 2025. There were regional decreases at rates of 5% in New Providence, 21% in Grand Bahama and 22% in the Family Islands District.

Crimes against the person increased to 279 incidents, from 262 over the same period in 2025. There was a regional decrease at a rate of 29% in the Family Islands District. However, there were increases at rates of 6% in New Providence and 48% in the Grand Bahama District.

**Homicides** decreased by 14% with 38 incidents, compared to 44 over the same period in 2025. There were 29 murders in New Providence, 3 in the Family Islands and 6 in the Grand Bahama District. The overall clearance rate stands at 58%. Victims between the ages of 18 and 45 represent 79% of all homicides. Retaliation, drugs and conflict were the most common motives for murder, representing 45% collectively. Based on preliminary figures, homicides were more likely to occur on a Friday than any other day of the week. Homicides were more prevalent in the Southeastern Division, accounting for 16% of the overall total. Firearms were used in the commission of 28 homicides and fatal gunshot wounds remain the leading cause of death in these matters. Males represent the highest percentage of victims of murder at 95%, compared to female victims at 5%.

**Armed Robberies** increased by 25% with 95 incidents, compared to 76 over the same period in 2025. Armed robberies were more prevalent in the Southwestern Division, accounting for 24% of the overall total. Based on preliminary figures, armed robberies were more likely to occur on a Saturday than any other day of the week and these incidents peak between the hours of 8pm and 12am. Most armed robberies occurred at the street level, businesses and at residences respectively. Firearms continue to be the weapon of choice for the commission of armed robberies. Notably, there were 27 vehicles taken in the commission of these incidents. Sixty-three percent of vehicles taken during armed robberies were recovered. Males represent the highest percentage of victims of armed robbery at 72%, compared to female victims at 28%.

**Robberies** decreased to 31 incidents, from 32 over the same period in 2025. Robberies were more prevalent in the South Central and Southeastern Divisions, accounting for 39% of the overall total. Based on preliminary figures, robberies were more likely to occur on a Thursday than any other day of the week and these incidents peak between the hours of 8am - 12pm. Two vehicles were taken in the commission of robbery incidents. Males represent the highest percentage of victims at 77%, compared to female victims at 23%.

**Stolen vehicles** decreased by 45% with 129 incidents, compared to 236 over the same period in 2025. Nissan make vehicles were the most targeted, representing 57% of all vehicles stolen. The Nissan Note and Cube were the predominant models stolen, while residences were the most targeted locations. Stolen vehicles were mostly reported in the Southwestern Division, accounting for 23% of the overall total. Fifty-three percent of all stolen vehicles were recovered.

**Stealing** increased to 430 incidents, from 394 over the same period in 2025. The most frequent items stolen included tools, cash, mechanical parts, building supplies, and cellular phones. Most stealing matters occurred at residences, businesses and at the street level respectively. Stealing were mostly reported in the Southwestern, Southeastern and Northeastern Divisions, accounting for 32% of recorded cases.

**Stealing from vehicles** increased to 122 incidents, from 92 over the same period in 2025. The most frequent items stolen were tools, cash, handbags, cellular phones, and other personal effects. Nissan Cubes and Honda Fits were mostly targeted in the commission of these offences. Based on preliminary figures, stealing from vehicles were more likely to occur on a Friday than any other day of the week. Stealing from vehicles were mostly reported in the Central, Southeastern and South Central Divisions, accounting for 41% of recorded cases.

**Housebreakings** decreased by 16% with 73 incidents, compared to 87 over the same period in 2025. The New Providence District accounted for 48 or 66% of all housebreakings. Grand Bahama, including Abaco and Bimini, accounted for 5 or 7% of housebreakings. The Family Islands District accounted for 20 or 27% of housebreakings, most of which occurred in Eleuthera with 12 incidents.

**Shopbreakings** decreased by 28% with 101 incidents, compared to 140 over the same period in 2025. The New Providence District accounted for 69 or 68% of all shopbreakings. Grand Bahama, including Abaco and Bimini, accounted for 15 or 15% of shopbreakings. The Family Islands District accounted for 17 or 17% of shopbreakings, most of which occurred in Andros with 10 incidents. Based on preliminary figures, shopbreakings were more likely to occur on a Monday than any other day of the week.

For the period in review, a total of 129 **firearms** and 3,264 **rounds of ammunition** were discovered and/or seized throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. As a result, 408 persons were arrested and 106 persons were charged with illegal firearms and ammunition offences. **ShotSpotter Technology** detected 481 gunshot incidents, consisting of 286 multiple shots, 171 single shots and 24 probable shots, totaling 1,585 rounds discharged.

Notably, the officers of the Royal Bahamas Police Force conducted 17,368 field check patrols, 77,028 stop and search profiles, 4,186 road checks, 1,993 warrants of arrest and 1,894 search warrants throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. As a result of these efforts, 7,503 persons were arrested for various major and minor offences. Of this number, 5,827 persons were charged and placed before the Court, representing a 78% charge rate. There were 2,602 **charge returns** which included 1,847 counts of conviction, 7 counts were discharged due to the defendant's death, 42 counts were acquitted at the end of trial, 364 counts were discharged by the court and 342 counts were withdrawn by the virtual complainant.

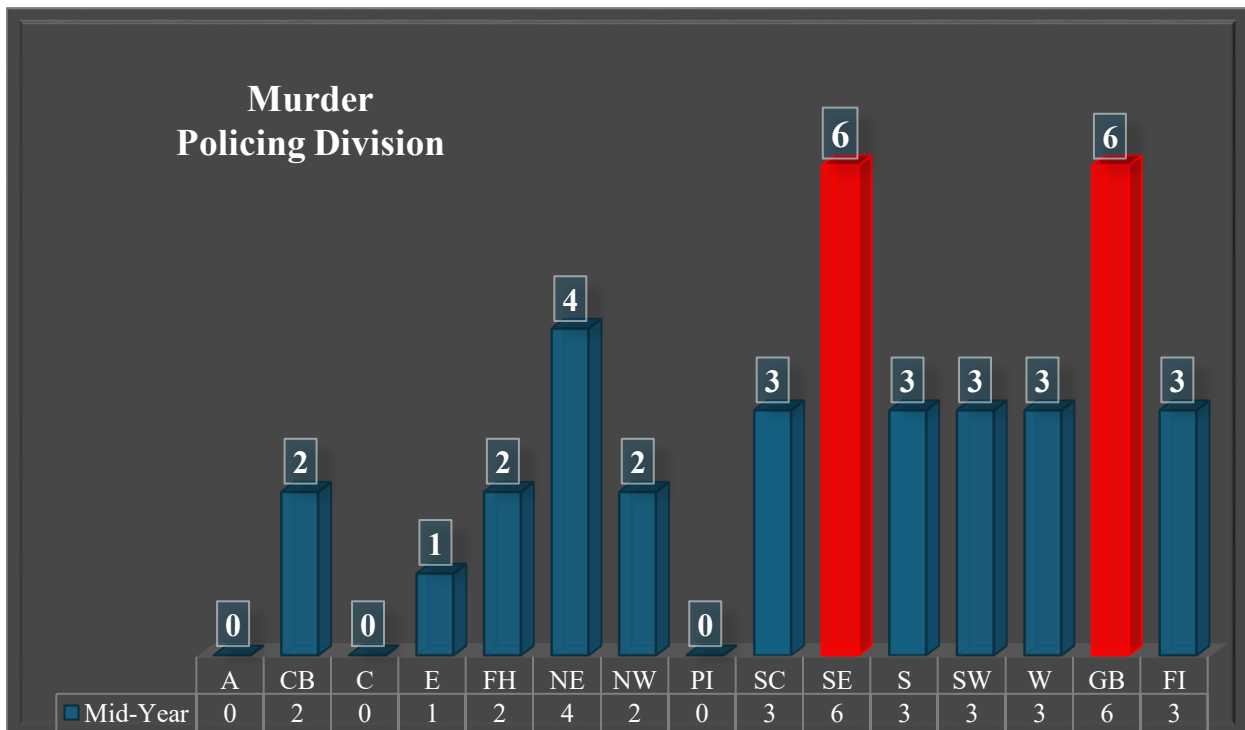
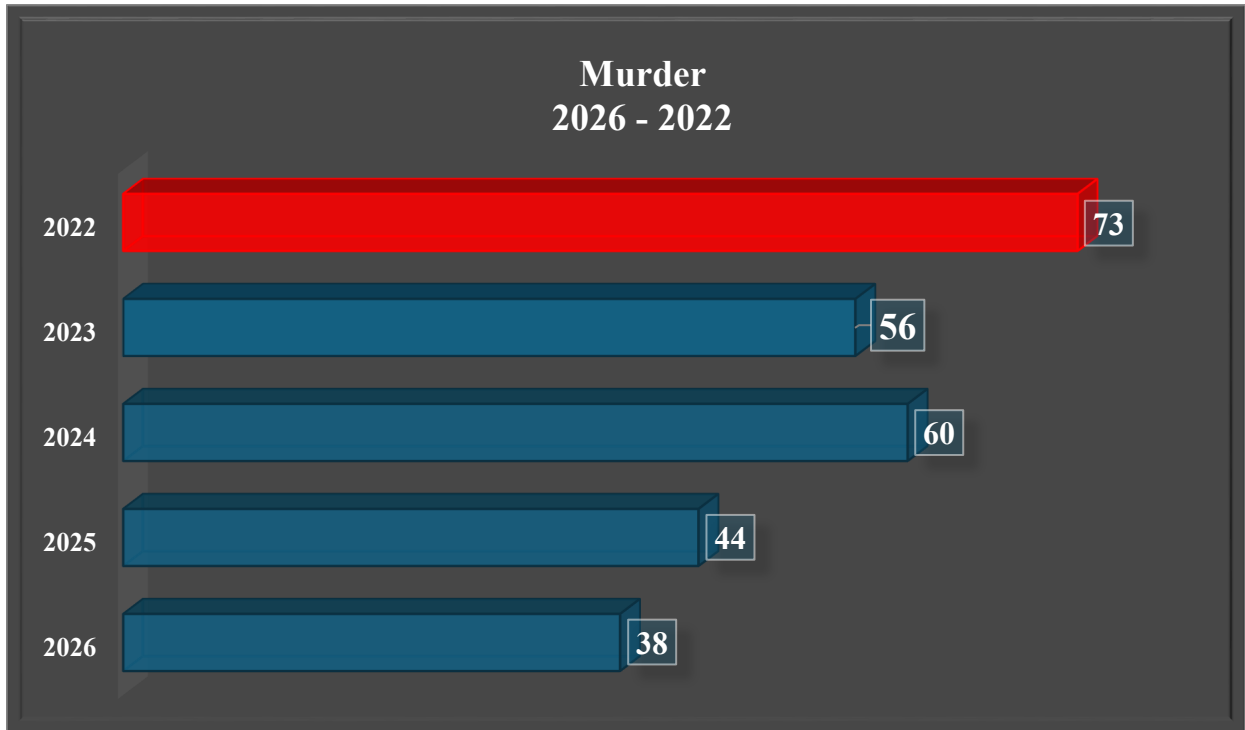

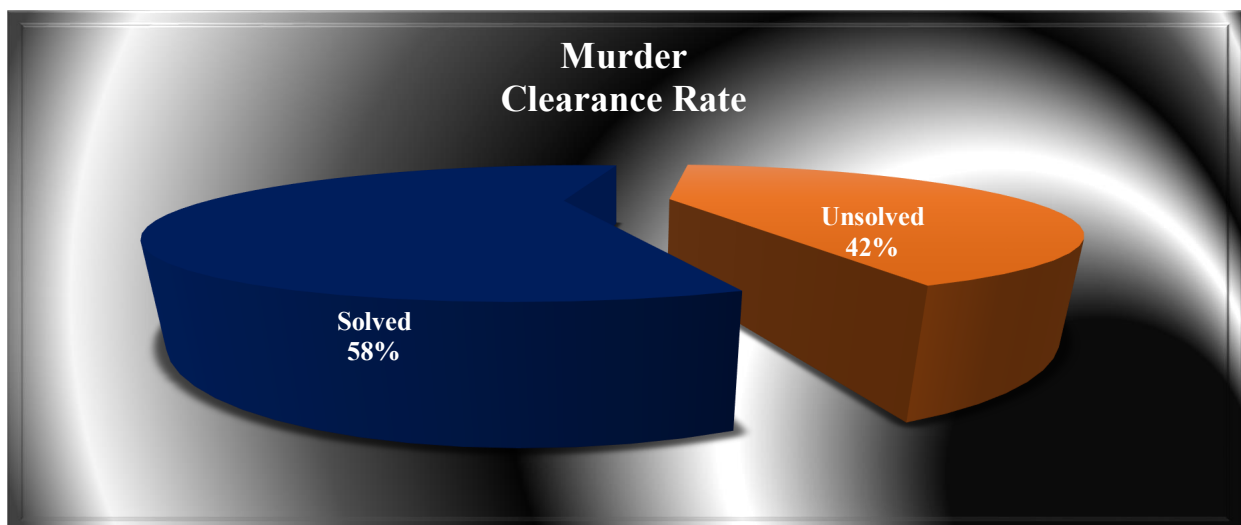
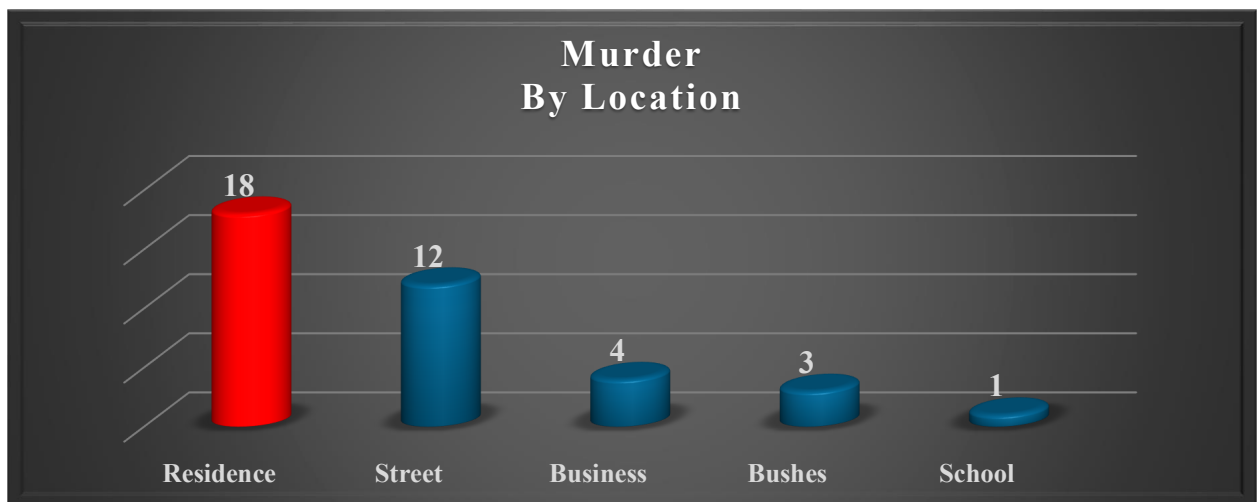
For the period in review, murder decreased by 14% with 38 incidents, compared to 44 over the same period in 2025.





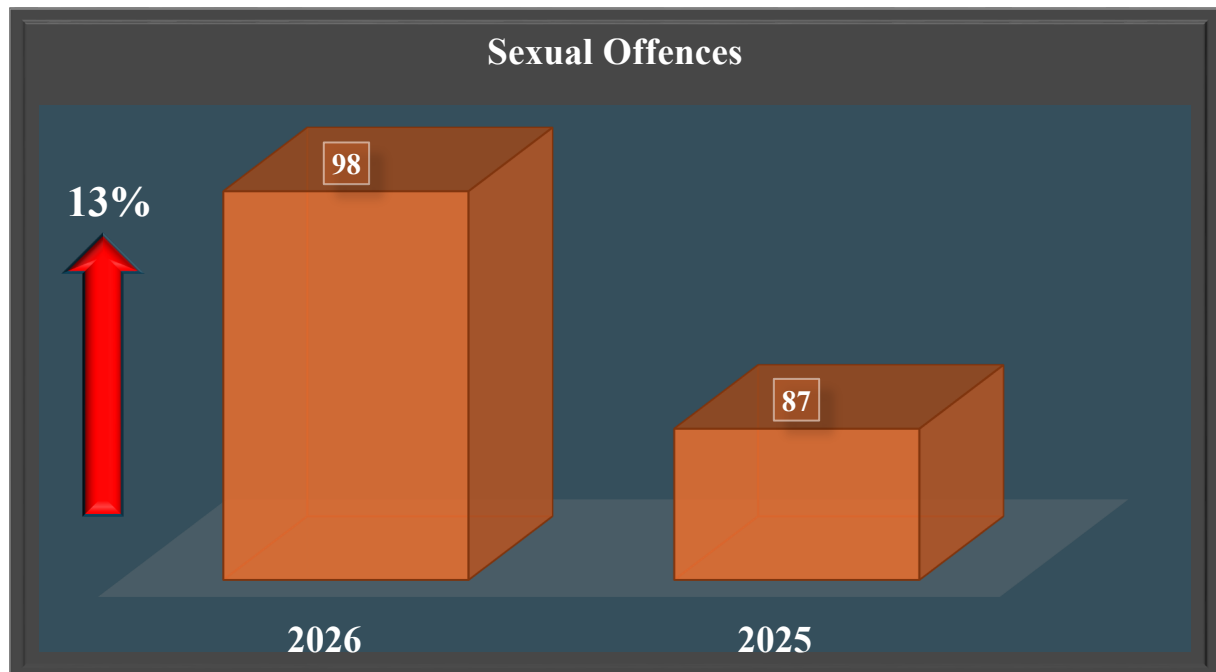
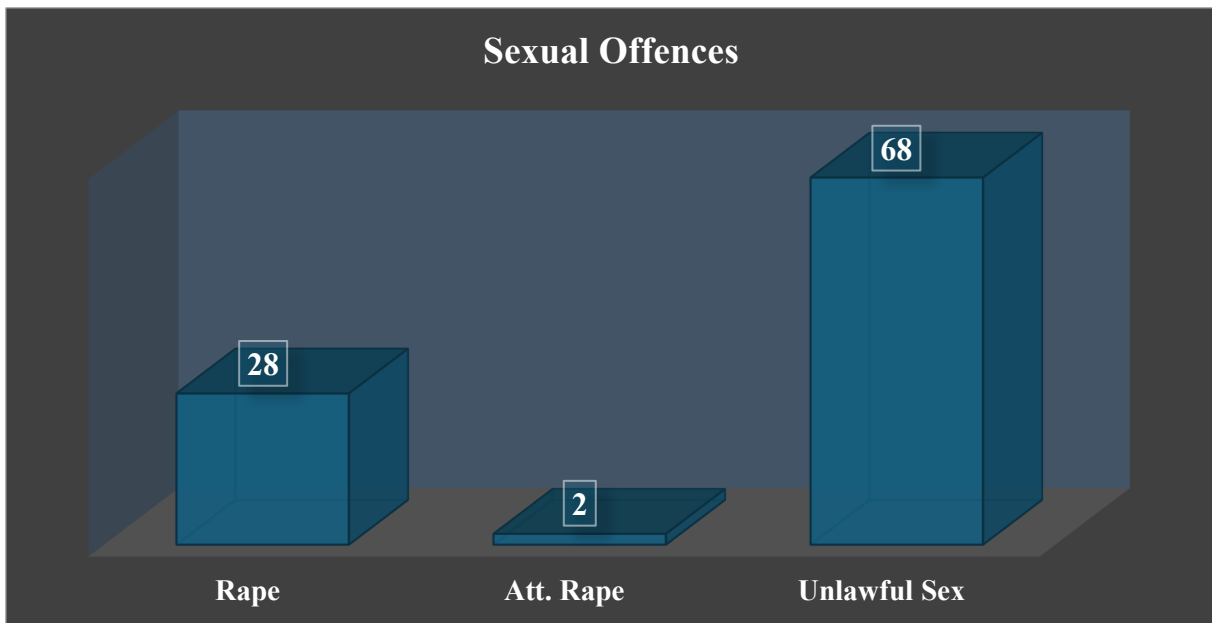


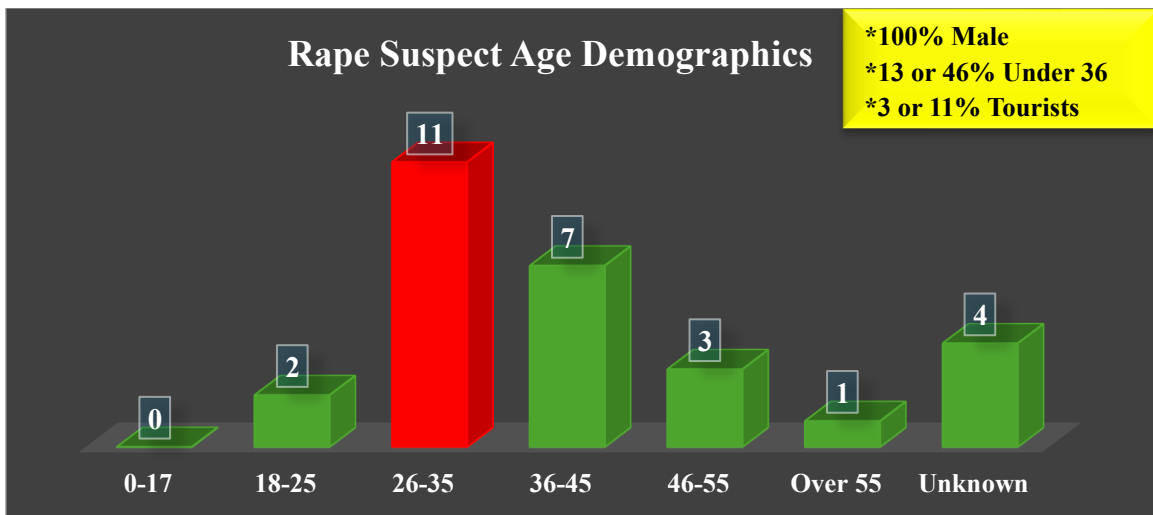
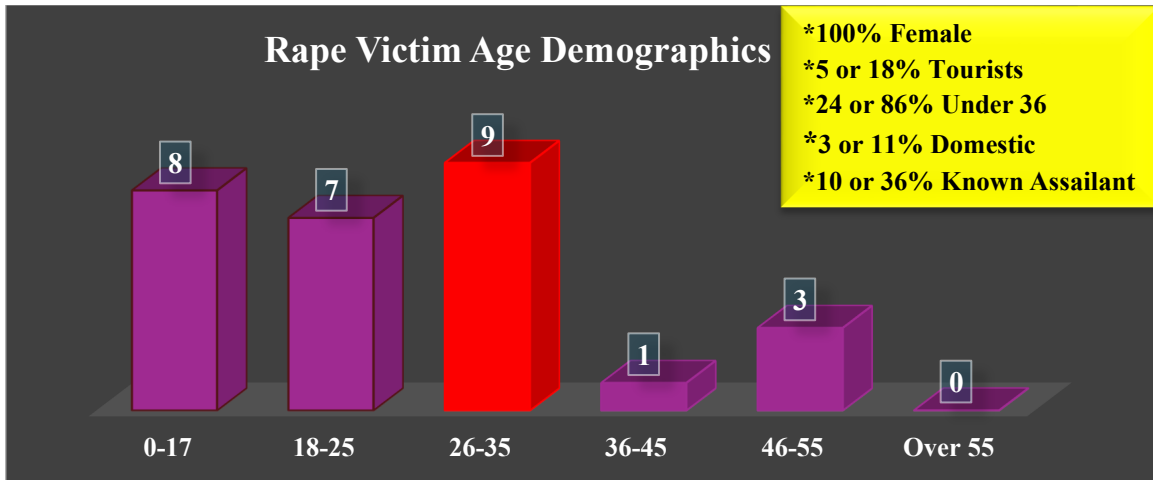

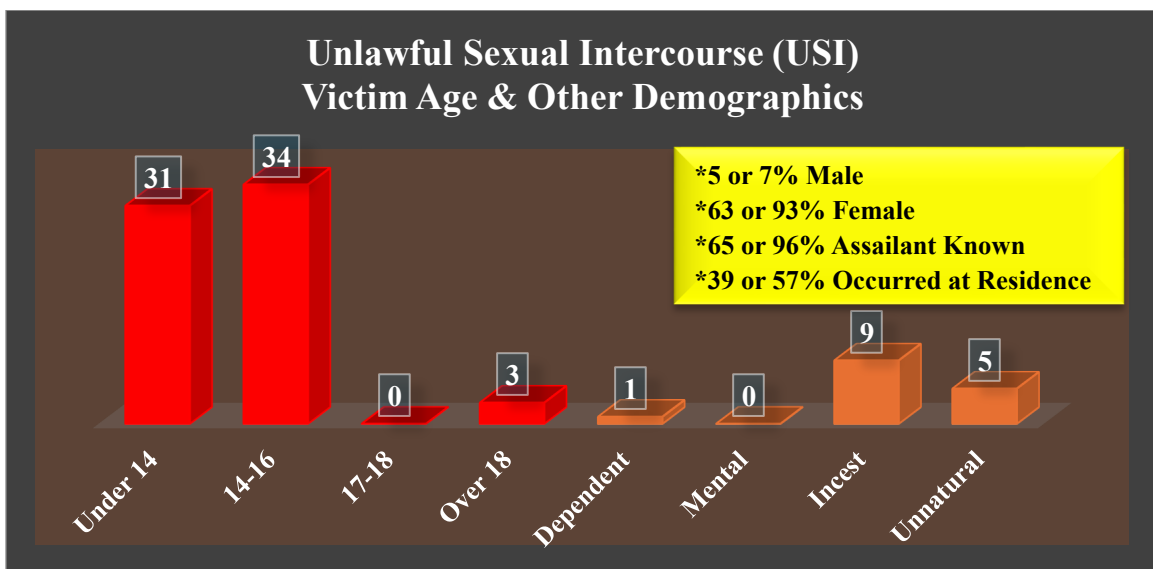
## Sexual Offences

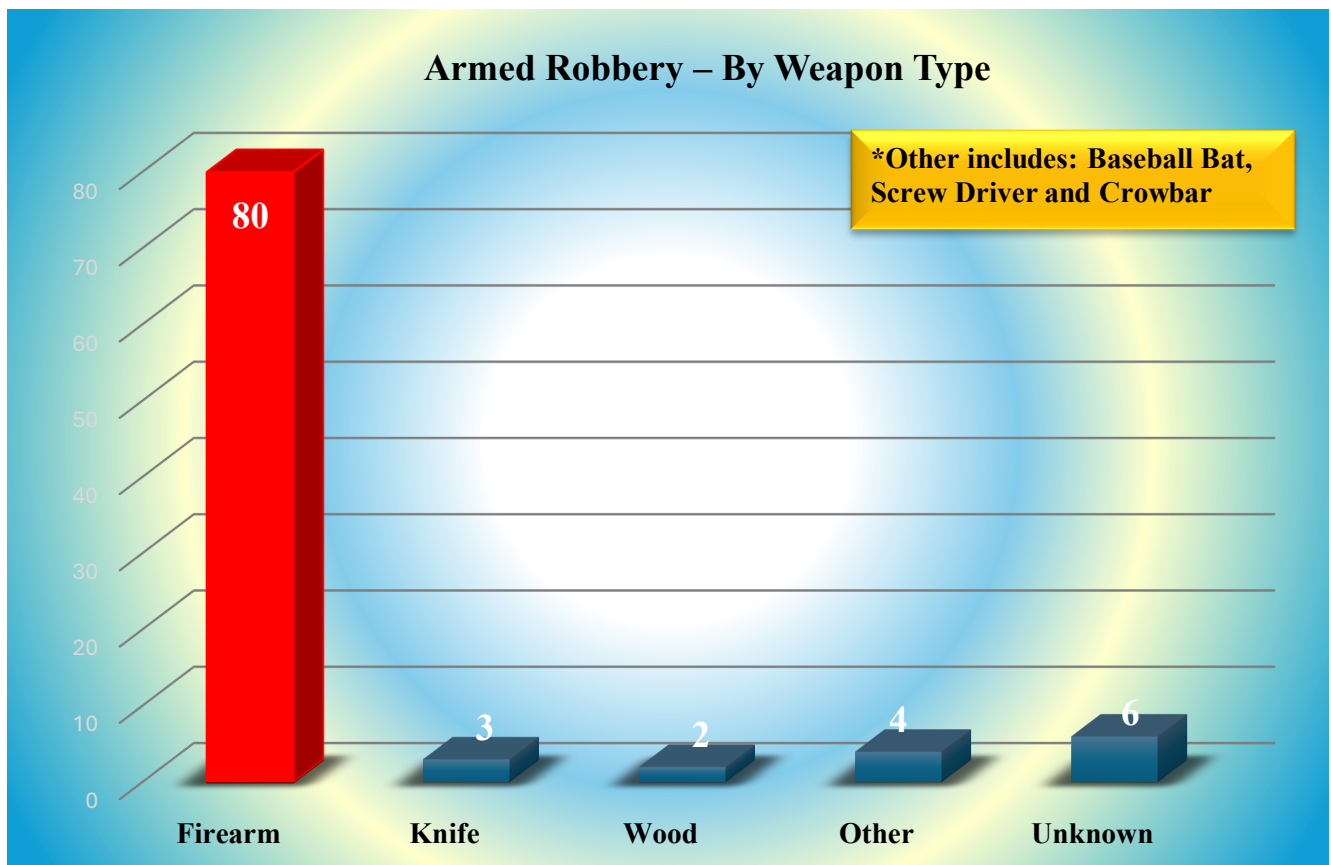
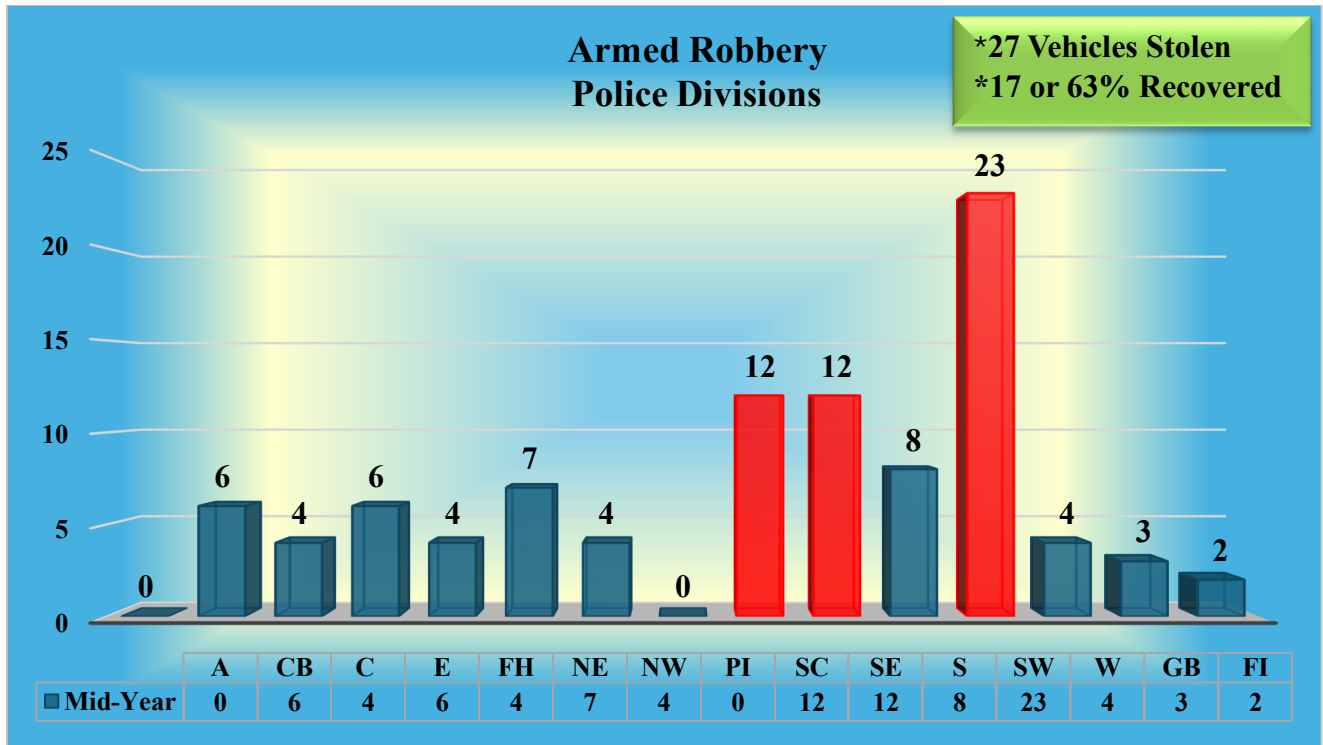


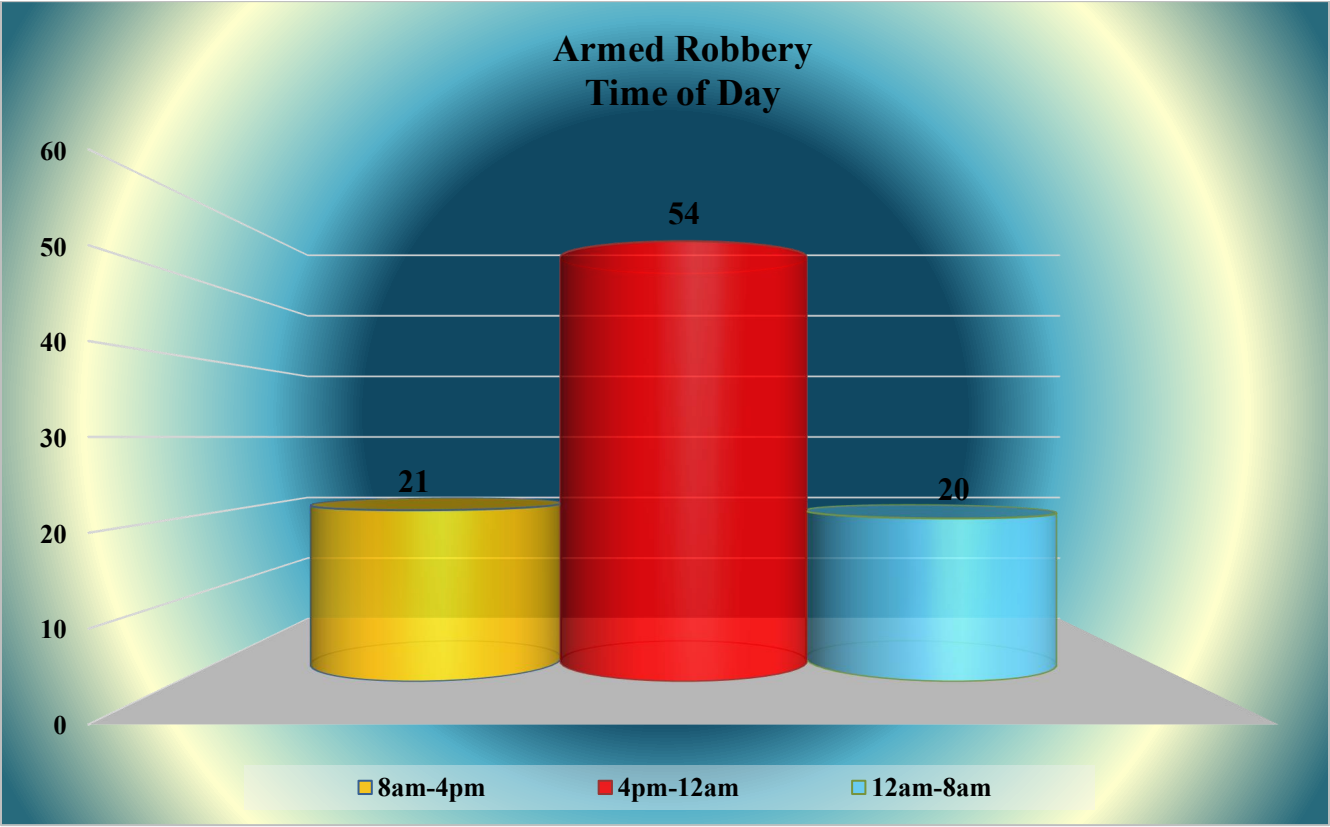
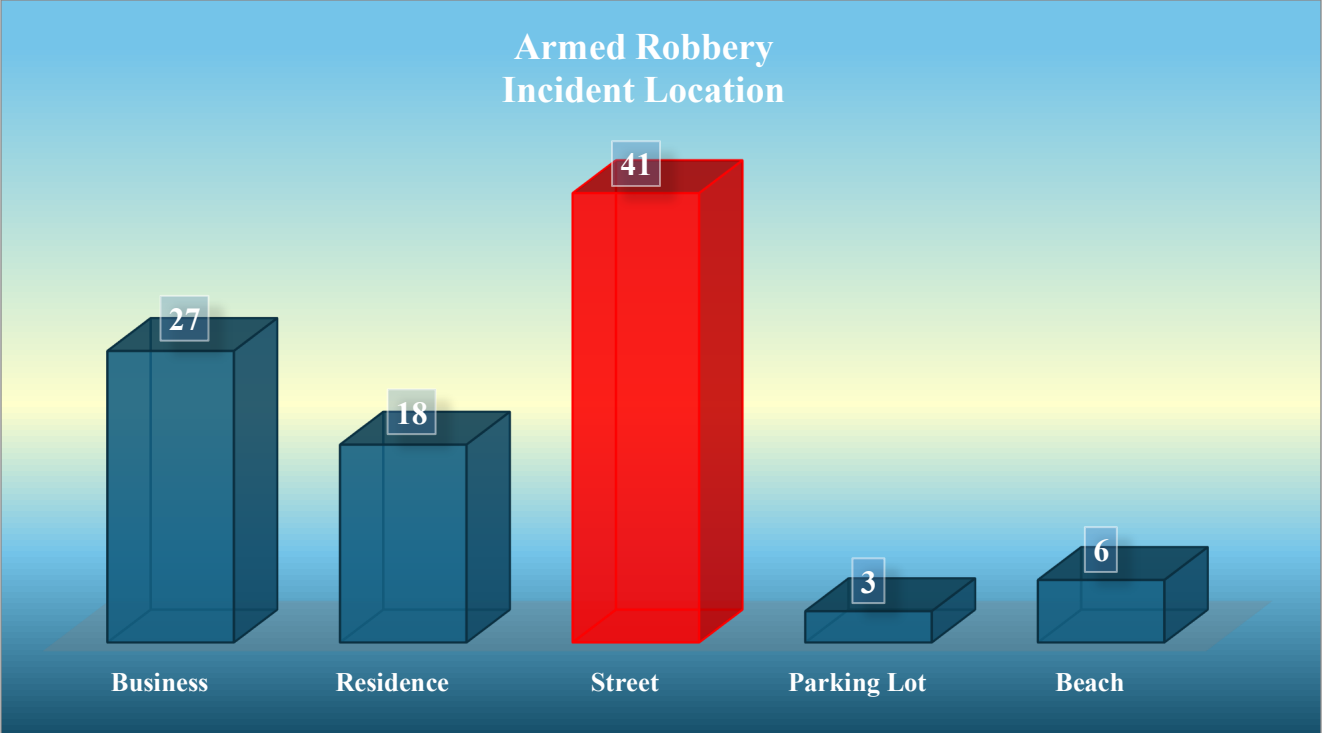
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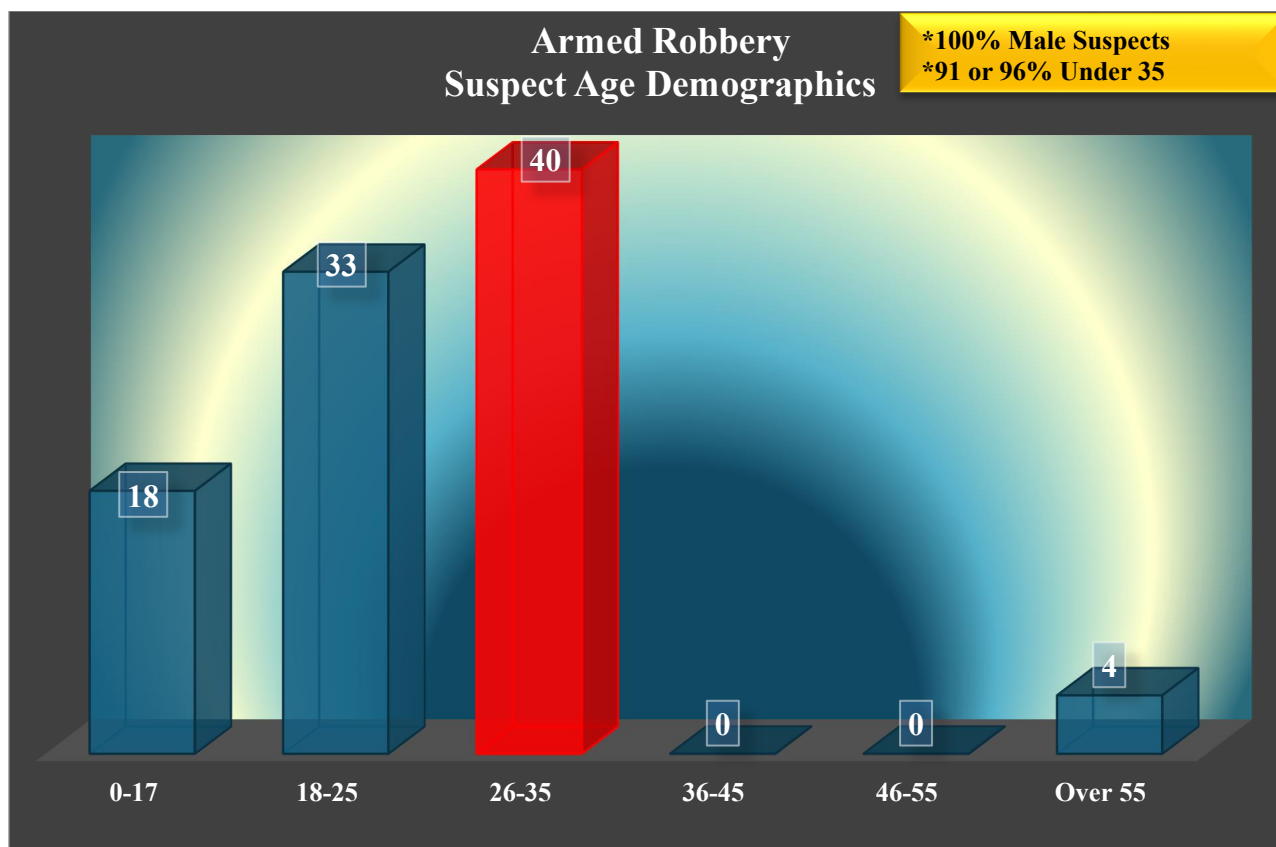
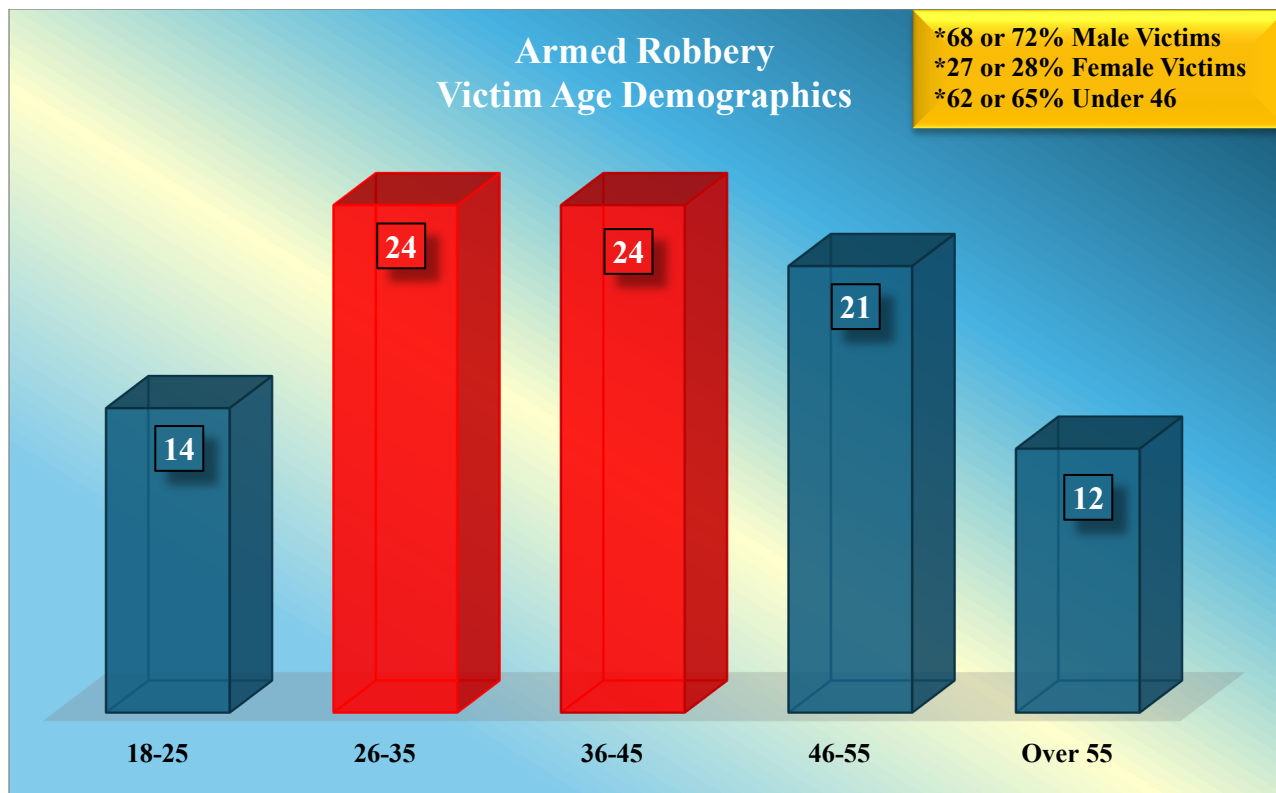
## Armed Robbery

For the period in review, armed robberies increased by 25% with 95 incidents, compared to 76 over the same period in 2025.



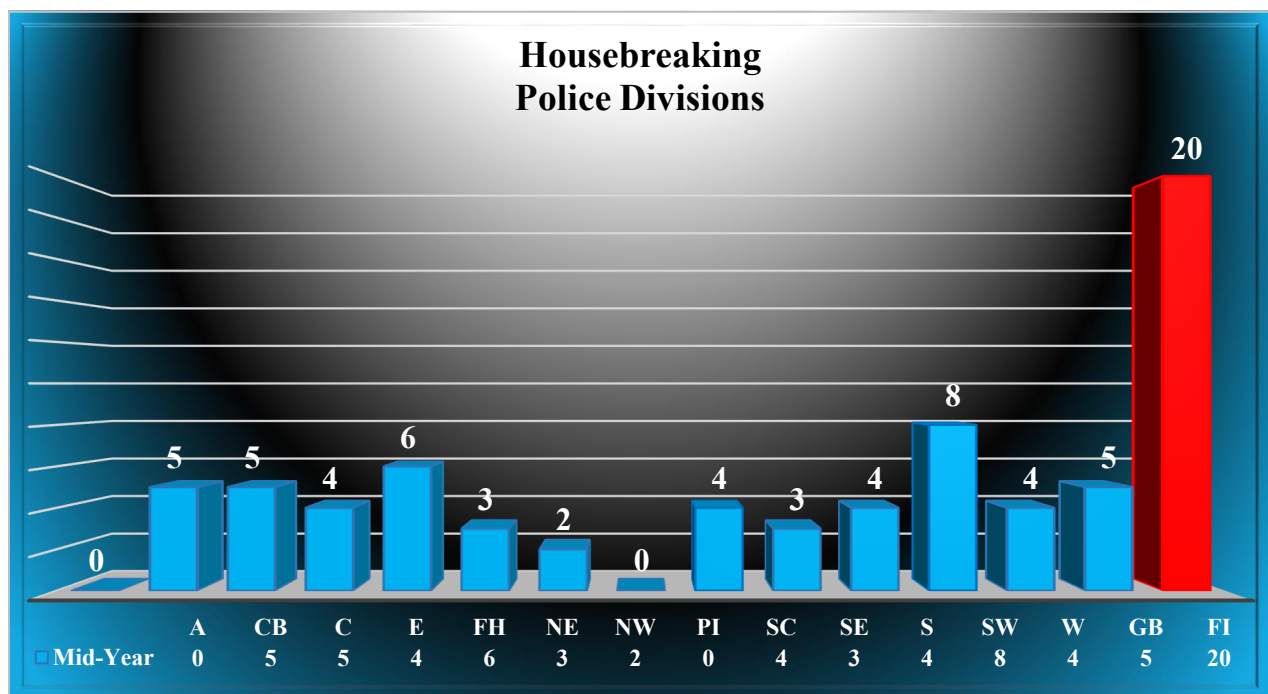
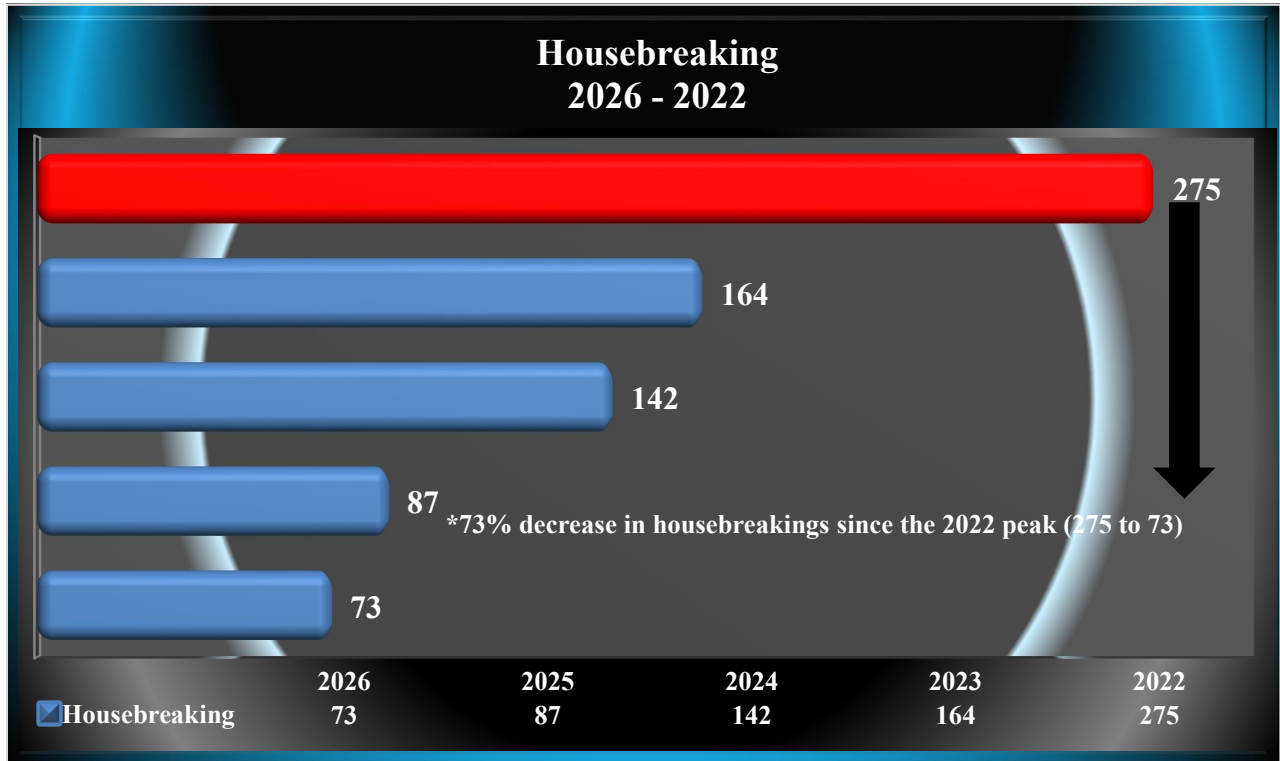

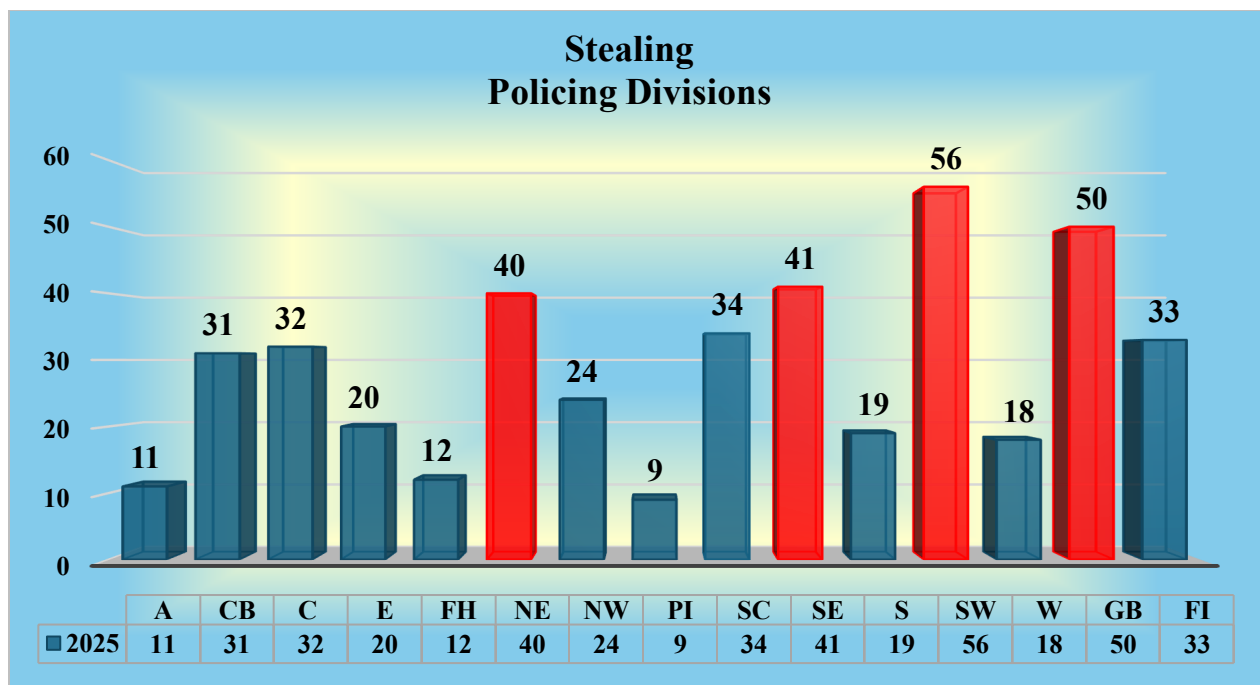
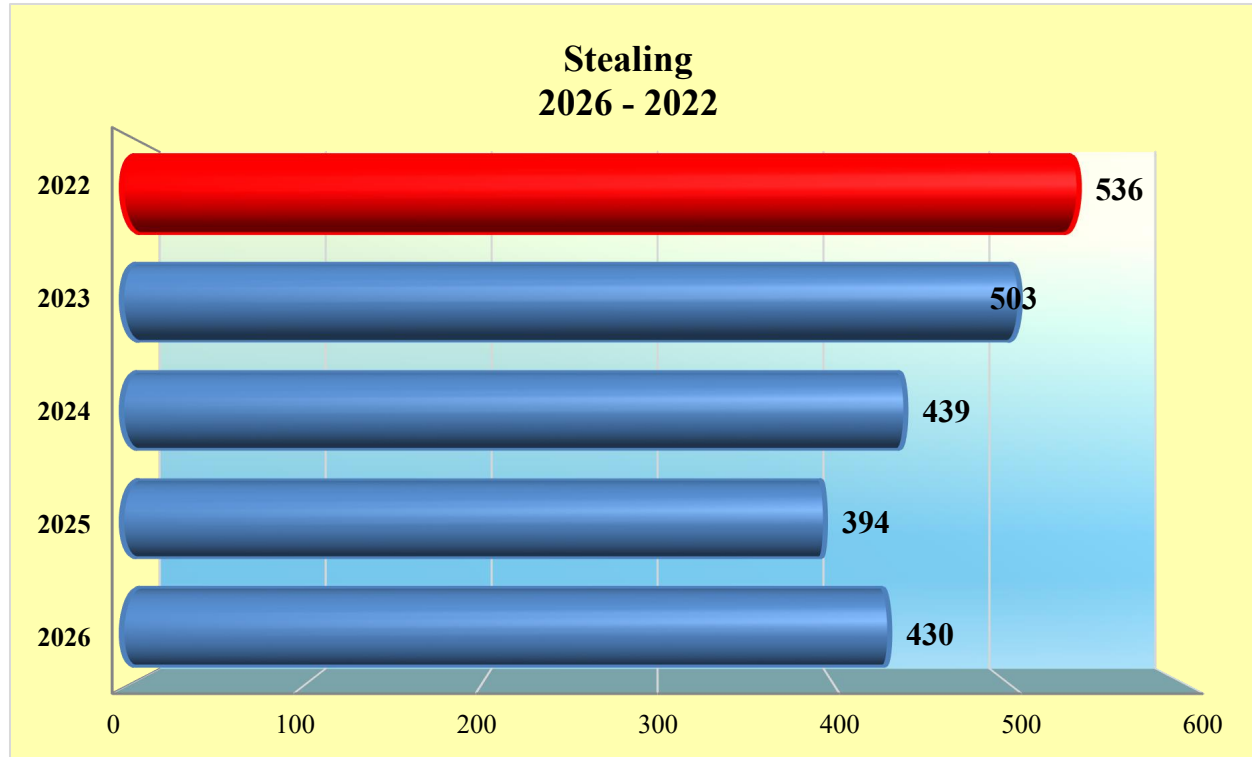
For the period in review, housebreakings decreased by 16% with 73 incidents, compared to 87 over the same period in 2025.

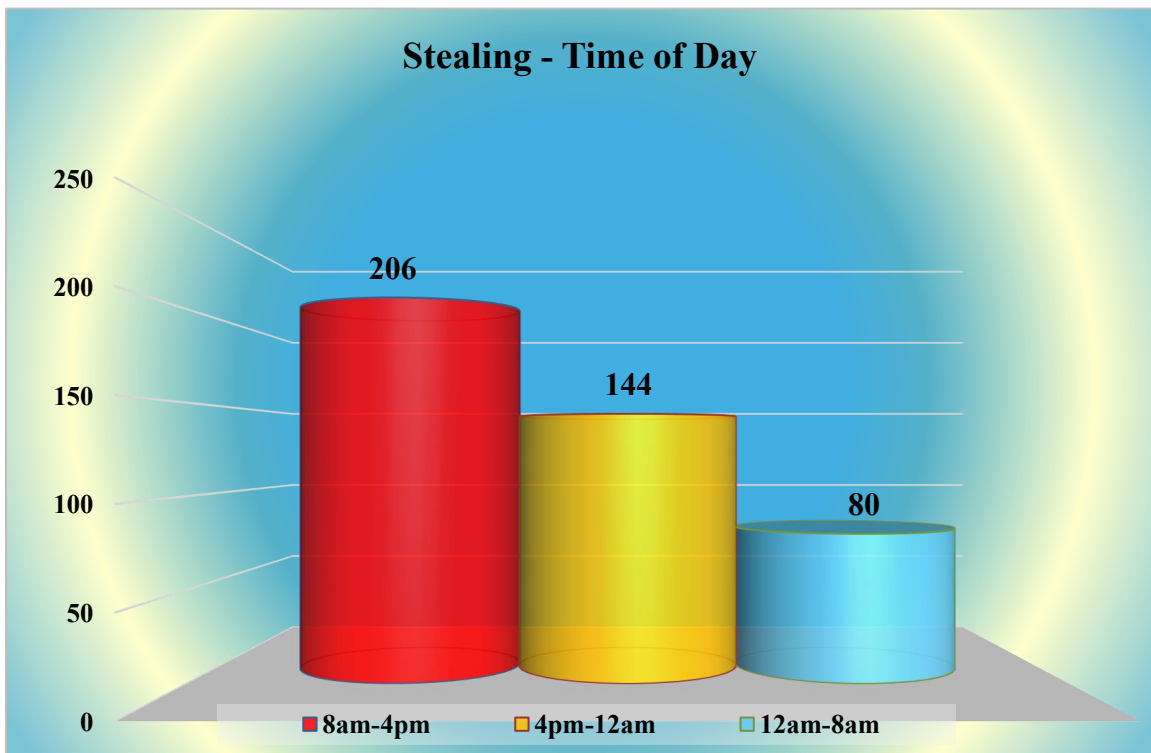
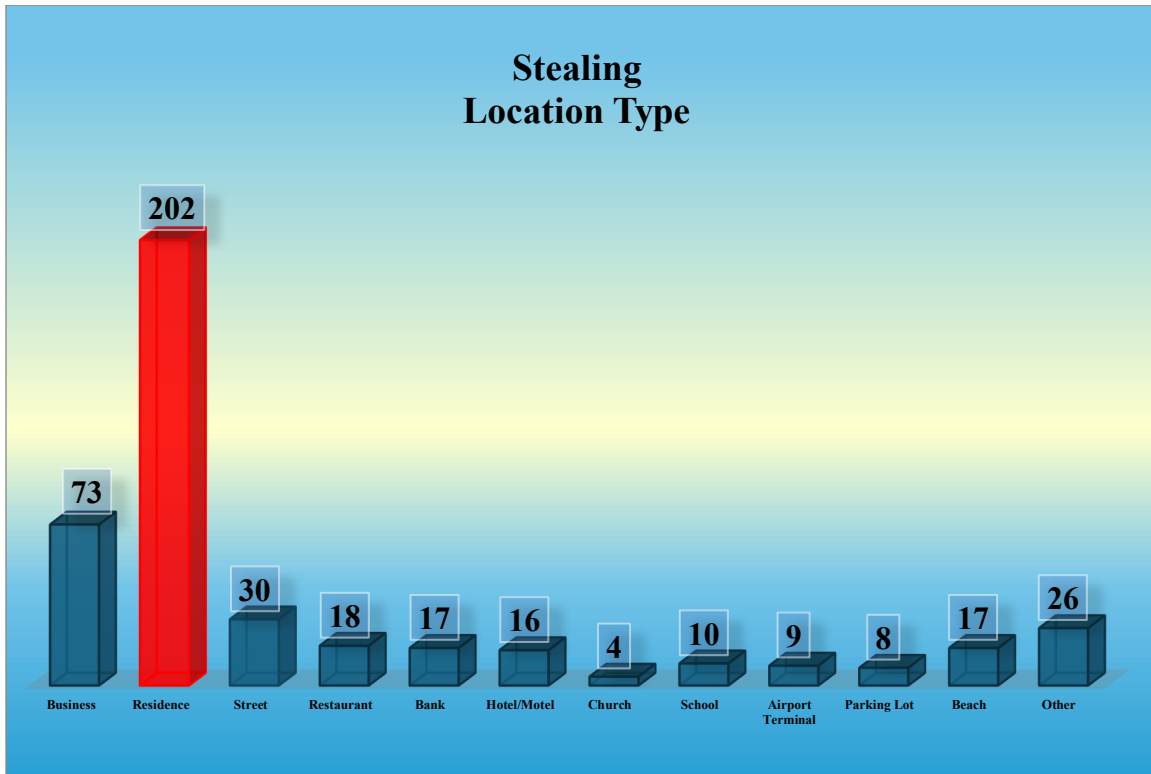


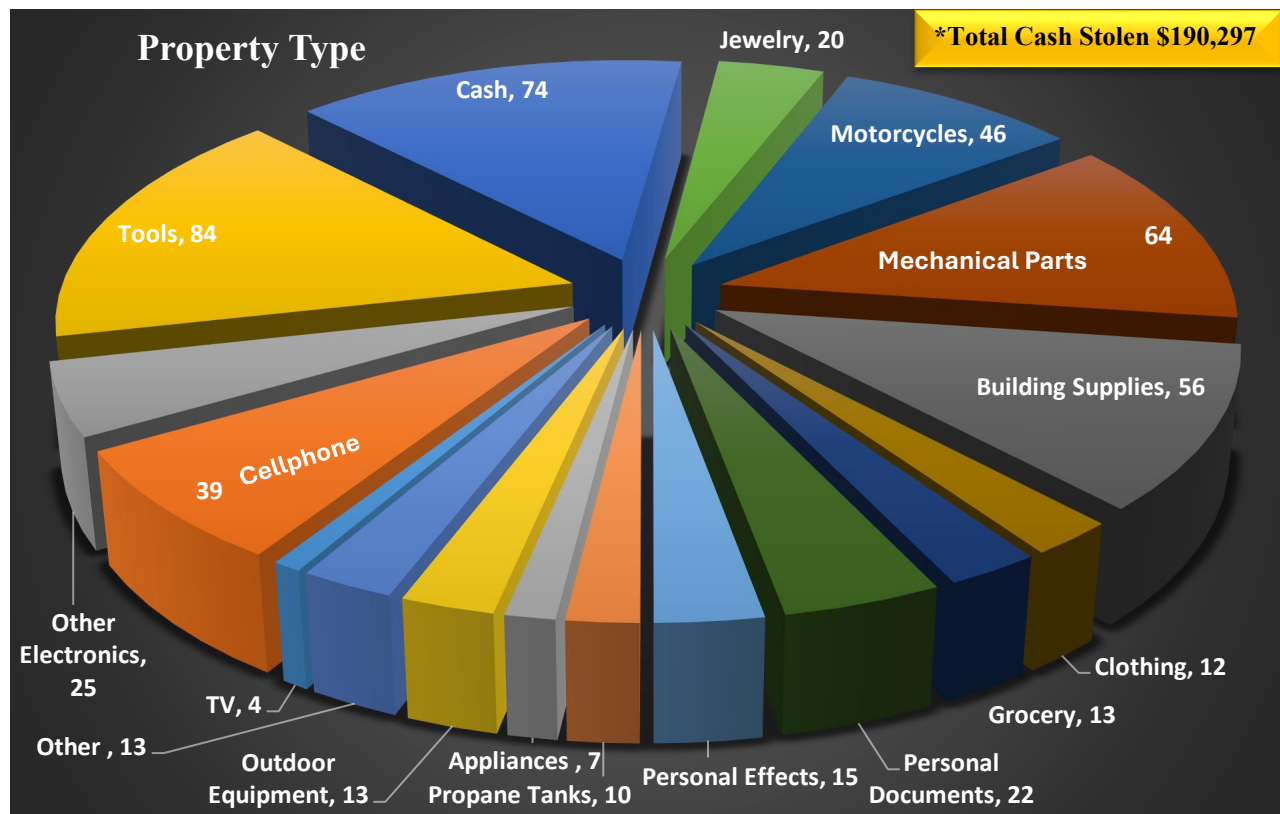

For the period in review, stealing matters increased by 9% with 430 incidents, compared to 394 over the same period in 2025.





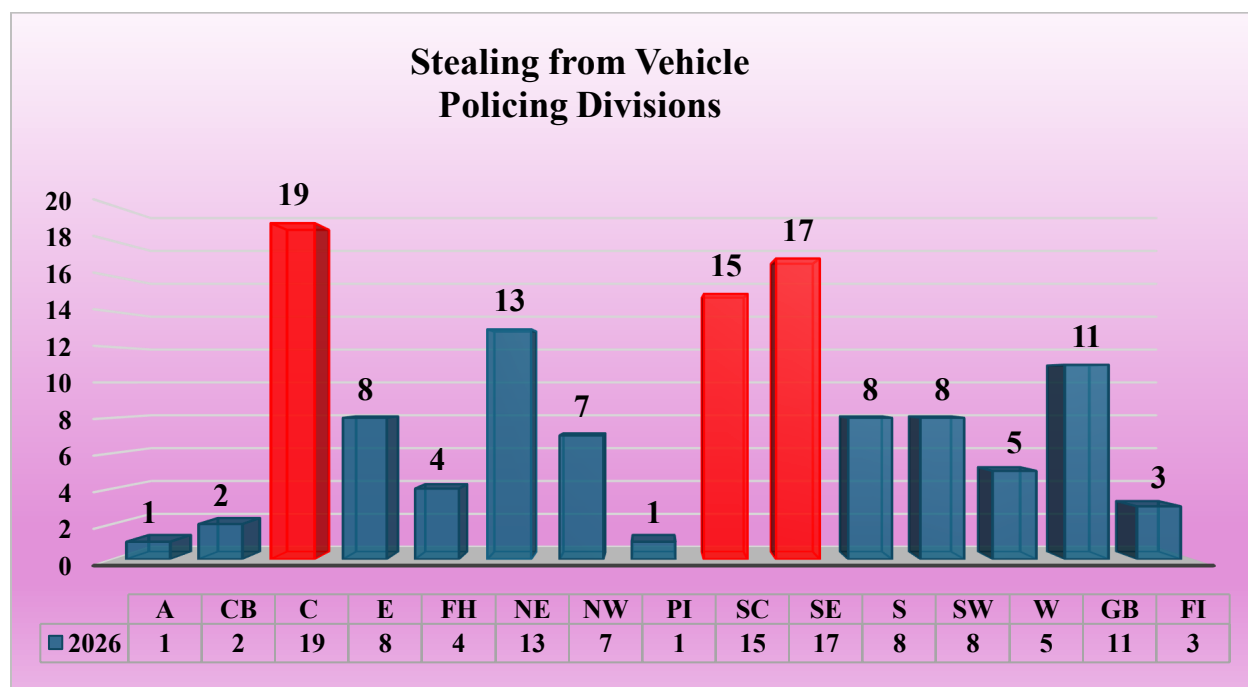
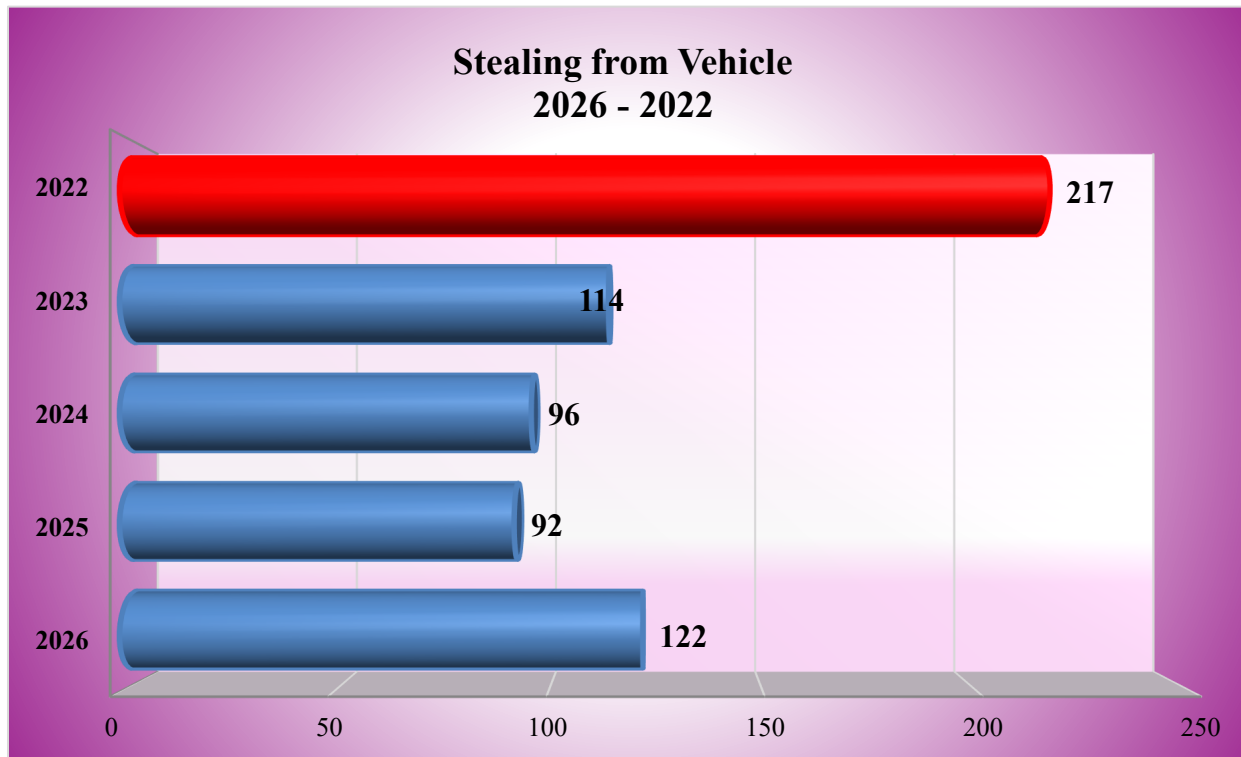


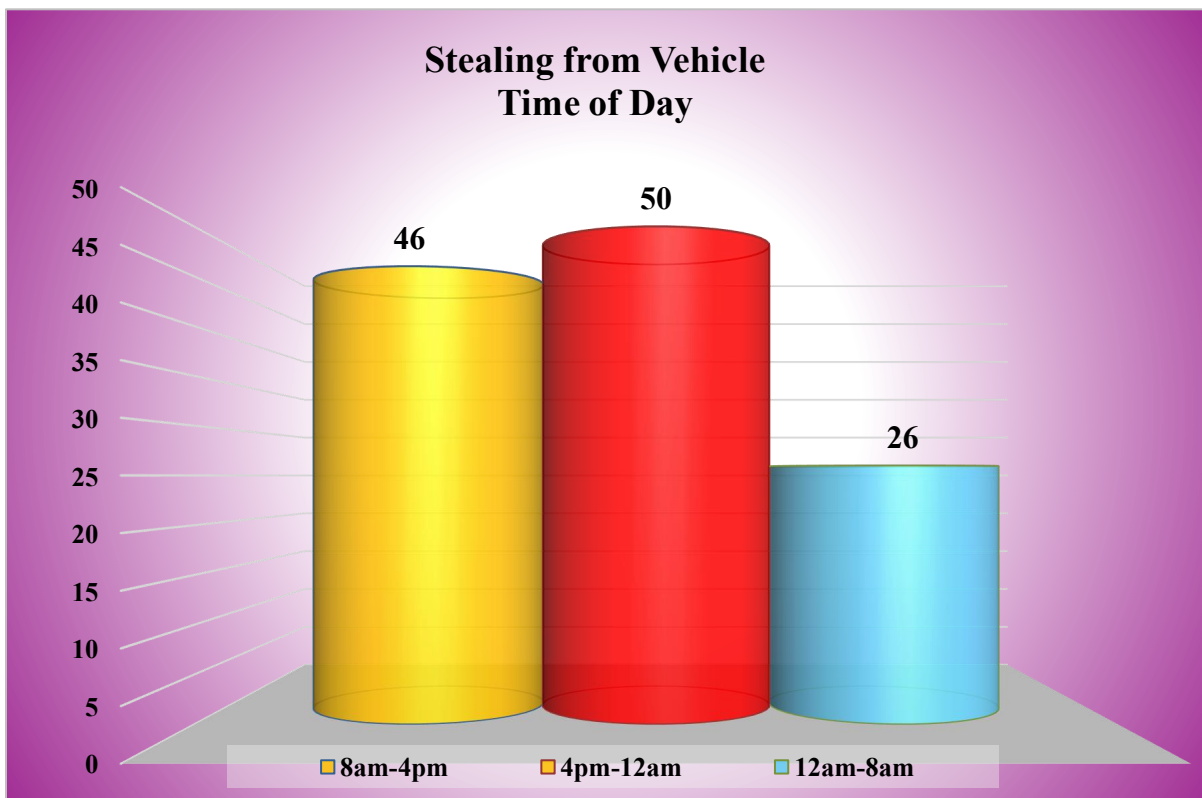
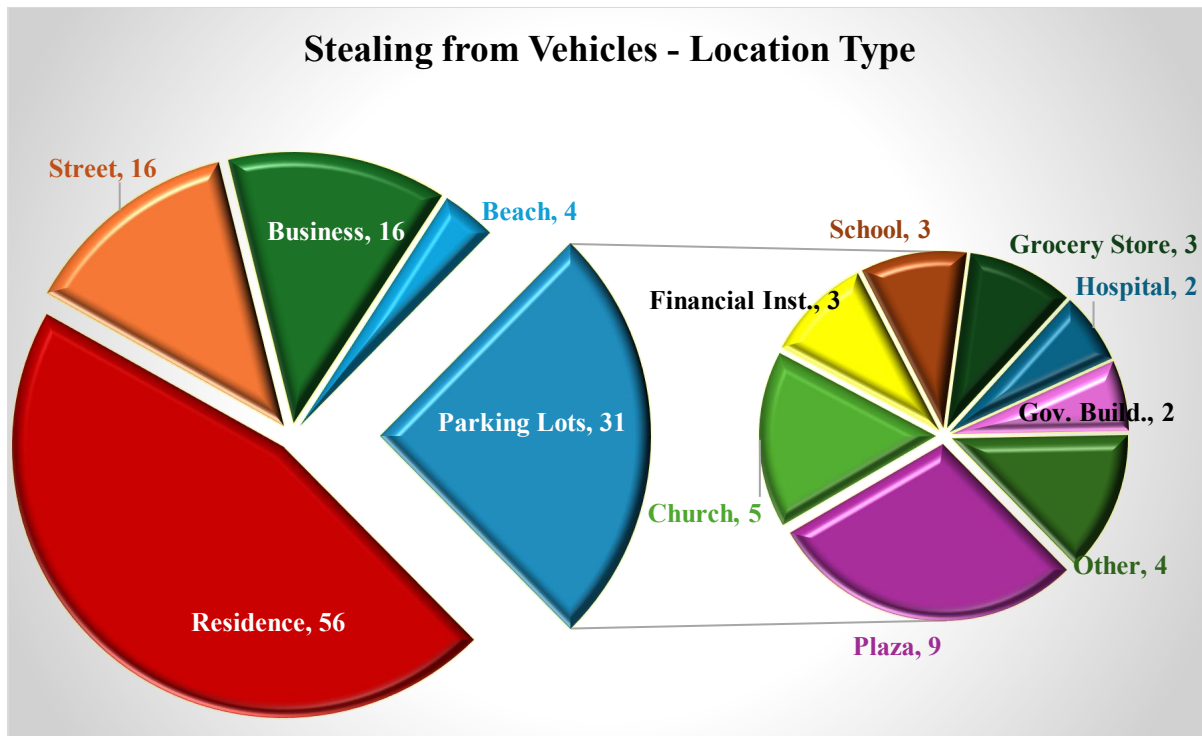

For the period in review, stealing from vehicle matters increased by 33% with 122 incidents, compared to 92 over the same period in 2025.





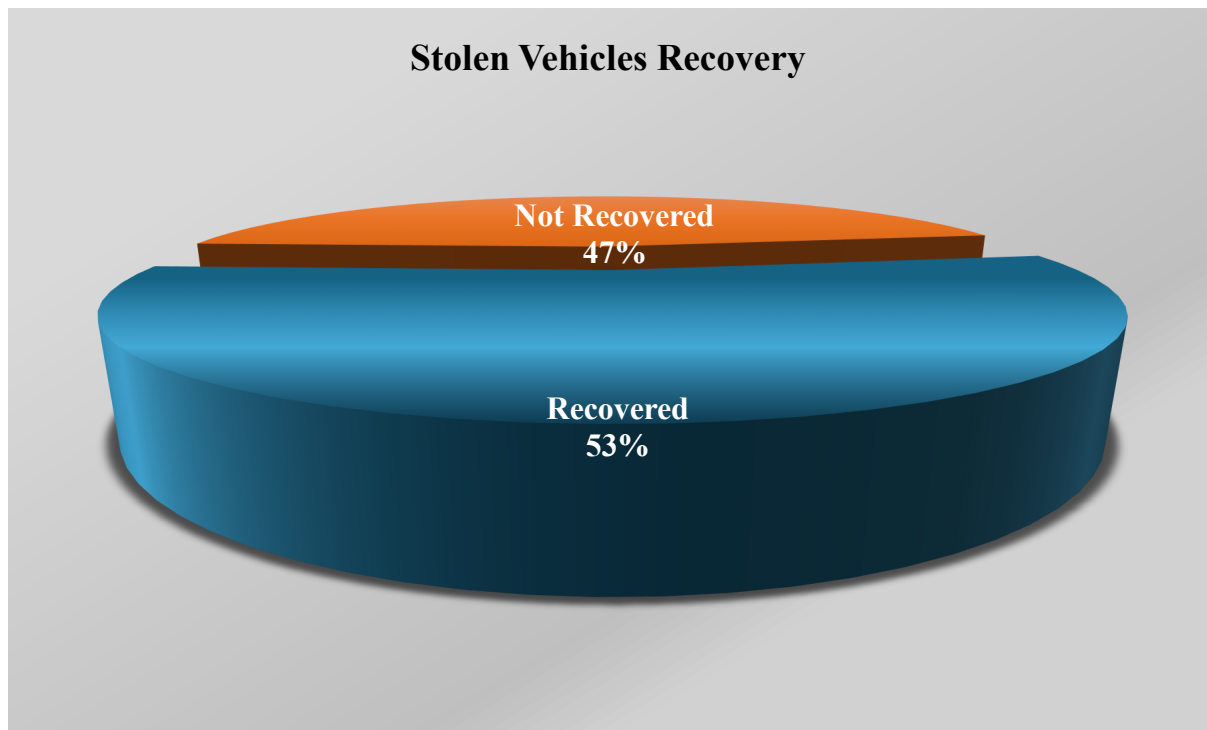
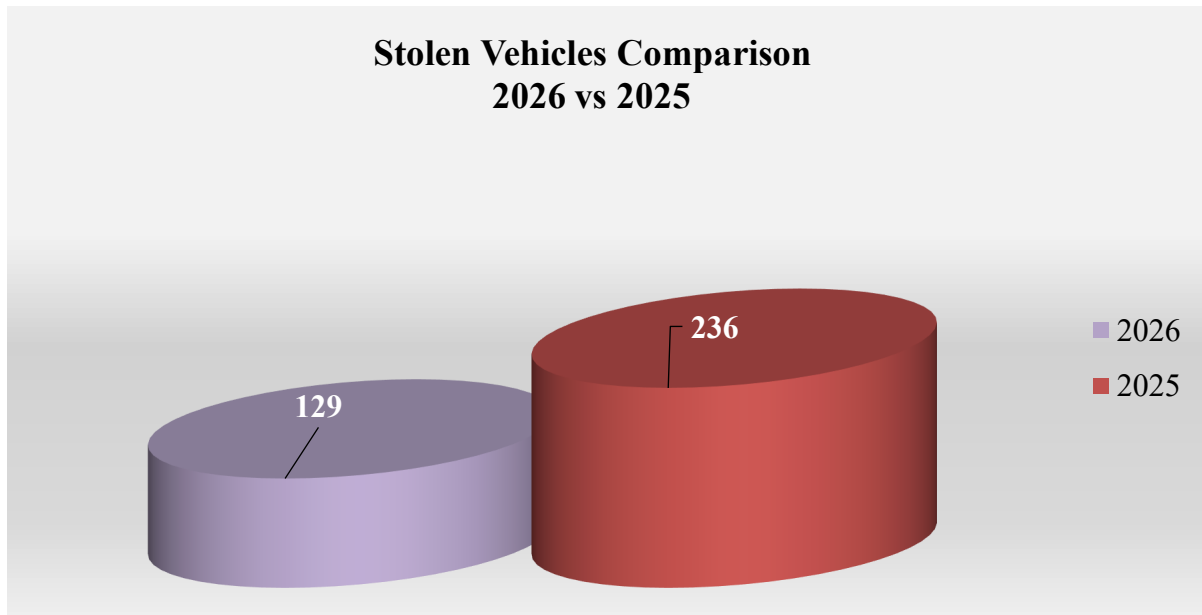

Stolen vehicles decreased by 45% with 129 cases, compared to 236 over the same period in 2025. Of this total, 69 vehicles were recovered.

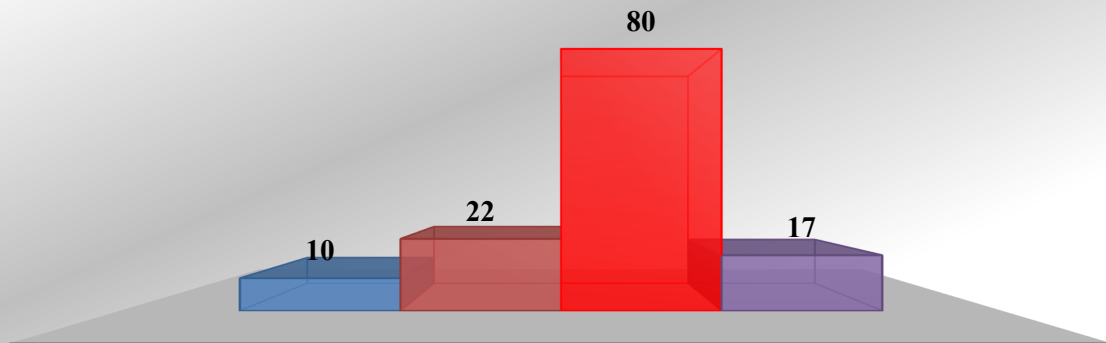

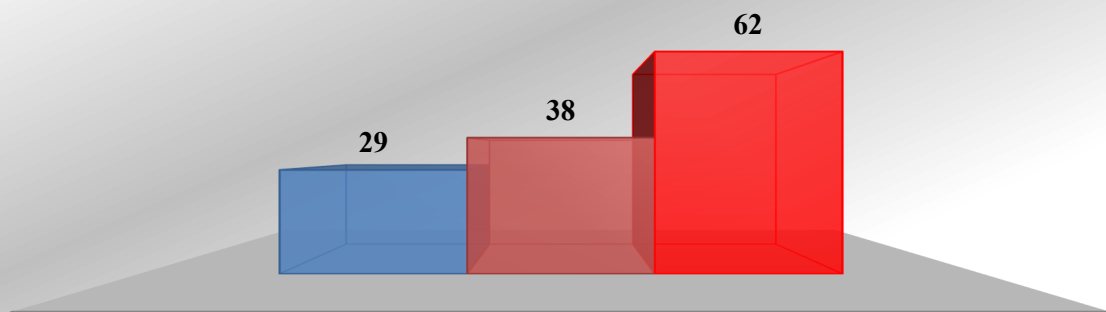
### Stolen Vehicles - Incident Location

■ Business ■ Parking Lot ■ Residence ■ Street



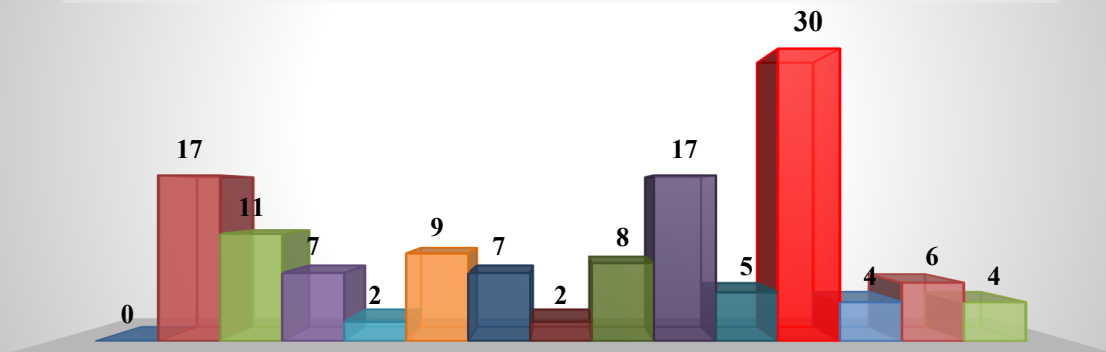
### Stolen Vehicles - Time of Day

## Persons Arrested

For the period in review, the police arrested **7,503 persons** for various major, minor, and traffic offences throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. Of this total, **77 persons were arrested for traffic offences** and **7,426 persons were arrested for criminal offences**. New Providence accounted for 5,409 or 72% of all persons arrested, Grand Bahama & the Northern Bahamas accounted for 1,502 or 20%, and the Family Islands District accounted for 592 or 8%. Males accounted for 6,359 or 85% of arrests, and females accounted for the remaining 1,144 or 15% of arrests.

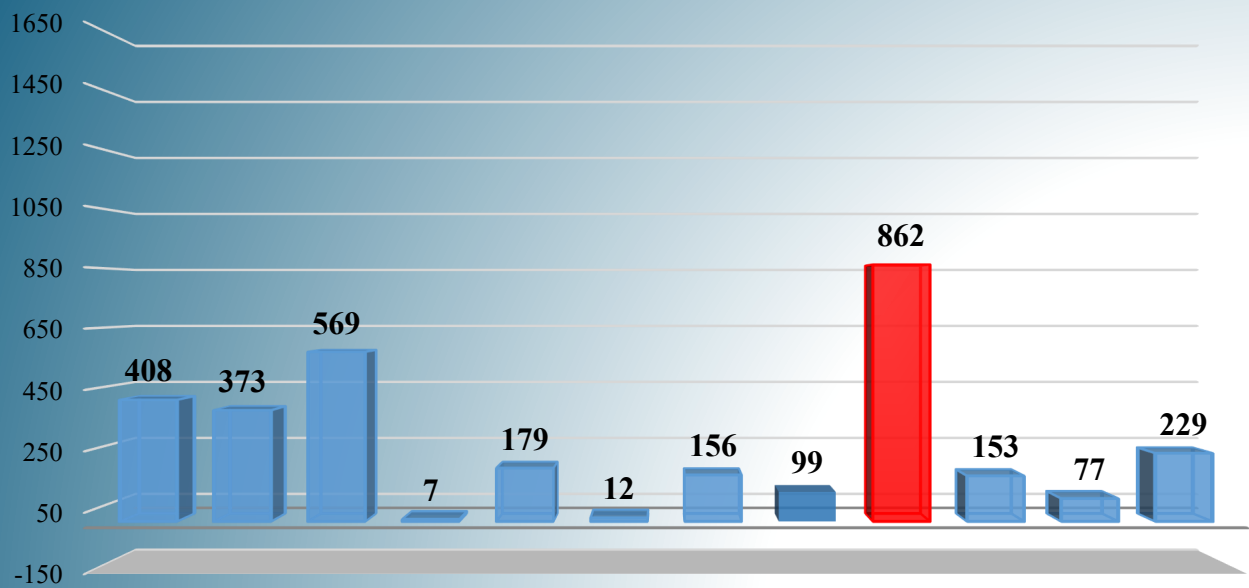


### Arrests - Policing Division

## Persons Charged

For the period in review, the police charged **5,827 persons** with various major, minor, and traffic offences throughout the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. Of this total, **1,453 persons were charged with traffic offences** and **4,374 persons were charged with criminal offences**. New Providence accounted for 4,545 or 78% of all persons charged, Grand Bahama and the Northern Bahamas accounted for 945 or 16%, and the Family Islands District accounted for 337 or 6%. Males accounted for 4,648 or 80% of persons charged, and females accounted for the remaining 1,179 or 20% of persons charged.





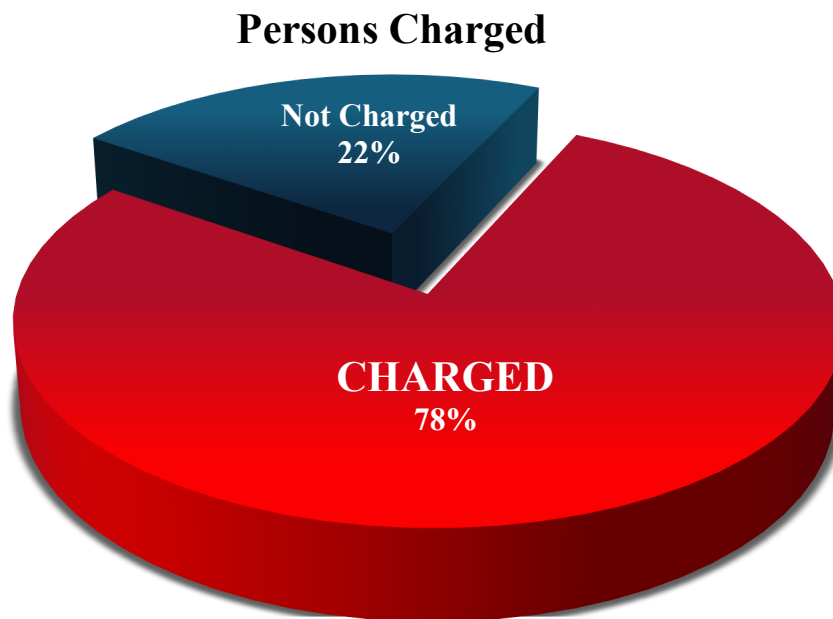

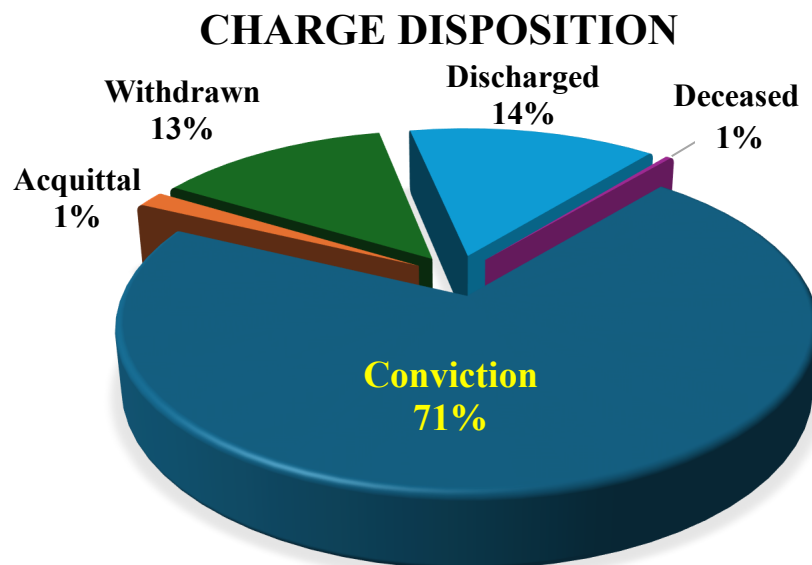

The period in review, there were 7,503 persons arrested, of which 78% or 5,827 suspects were charged before the Court.

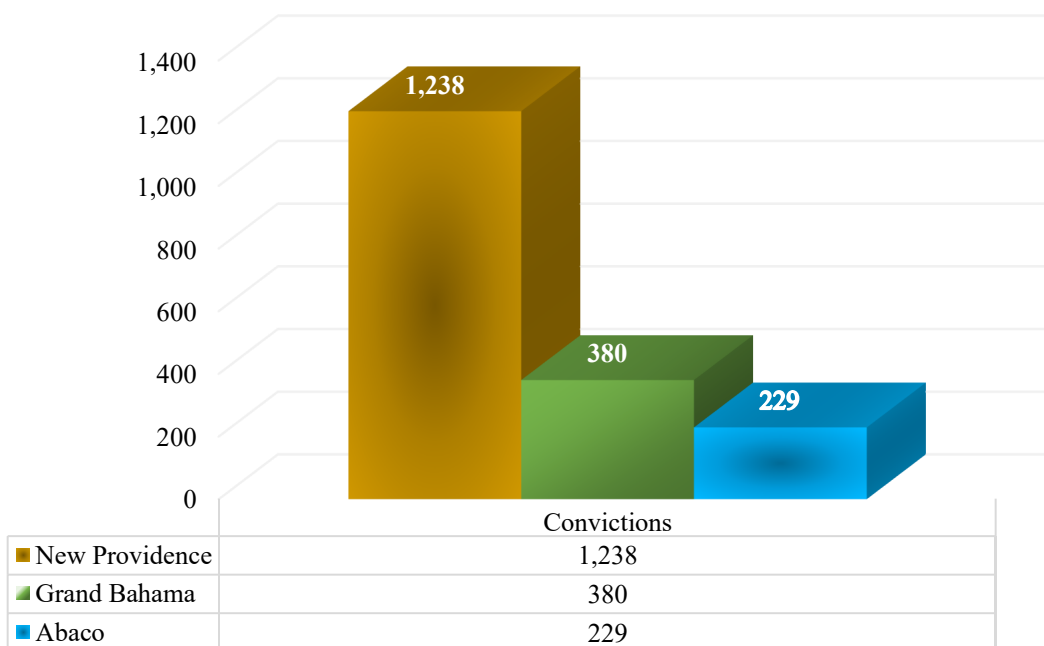


## Court Charge Dispositions

For the period in review, there were 2,602 charge returns which included 1,847 counts of convictions, 7 counts were discharged due to the defendant's death, 42 counts were acquitted at the end of trial, 364 counts were discharged by the court and 342 counts were withdrawn by the virtual complainant.
